

U.S. Attempts To Seat Congo

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — The United States last night won in its efforts to push a resolution through the UN General Assembly's Credentials Committee recommending the seating of a Congo delegation headed by President Joseph Kasavubu.

Only the Soviet Union opposed the U.S. resolution, approved by a vote of 6-1.

Kennedy Retains Small Vote Margin

The popular vote for the presidency as of 10 p.m. EST indicated that John F. Kennedy held a margin of 358,790. This is based on returns from 164,649 of 166,137 precincts.

The count was:
Kennedy 33,685,237; 50.3 per cent.
Nixon 33,326,447; 49.7 per cent.

Kennedy had won a total of 23 states with a total of 338 electoral votes including 18 uncommitted electors in Alabama and Georgia.

Nixon had won 25 states with 188 electoral votes and was leading in one other state with three electoral votes.

A slate of unpledged electors won in Mississippi with eight electoral votes.

The popular vote was the tightest in any election since the first Benjamin Harrison - Grover Cleveland race in 1888. Republican Harrison won an electoral victory then while running more than 100,000 behind in popular vote.

PITTSBURGH (AP) — A raging fire, which police say was accidentally touched off by children playing with matches, destroyed an abandoned three-story brick building on Pittsburgh's South Side yesterday.

Navy Boosts Flight Range Of Polaris

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—The Navy successfully launched an advance Polaris missile on a record 1,600-mile flight yesterday and scored a significant break-through in its program to increase the range of the submarine weapon.

Project officials, pleased with the result of the new model's maiden flight, reported the missile achieved all test objectives in streaking 300 miles farther than any previous Polaris. Range and accuracy were not vital goals of this initial test.

The new Polaris series, designated A2, contains several improvements over the well-tested A1 model. It eventually will have a range of 1725 miles, compared with 1380 miles for the A1 rocket.

The shorter-range Polaris is scheduled to become operational next week, when the atomic submarine George Washington goes to sea with 16 nuclear-armed missiles.

Radical changes have been made in both stages of the advanced missile.

Aerojet General Corp. maker of the first-stage motor, has added 30 inches to the length, increasing the over-all height of the Polaris to about 31 feet.

Labor Bureau Notes Increase In Unemployed

WASHINGTON (AP) — Unemployment took an unexpected turn for the worse in October, moving past 3.5 million. And it may be headed toward a recession-type level of more than five million in January.

The gloomy facts came out officially yesterday in the Labor Department's regular monthly jobs report—one the administration has been charged with suppressing until after the election for political purposes.

George Meany, president of the AFL-CIO, said last week the number of jobless in October went past 6 per cent of the total work force and called this a serious danger point for the economy.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. (AP) — Unemployment continues to affect Pennsylvania more than the nation as a whole, the Bureau of Business Research at Pennsylvania State University said yesterday.

Dr. R. Hadley Waters, the bureau's analyst, said in the October issue of the Pennsylvania Business Survey that both general business and industrial activity in the commonwealth have been on the decline since February.

Scientist Says USSR Can Put Man in Space

MOSCOW (AP) — A Soviet scientist said today the U.S.S.R. has the "means and conditions" for sending a man into space but needs "practical experience" in handling space ships before the attempt is made.

The vote came as the climax to a stubborn battle by the Soviet Union, the United Arab Republic and Morocco to have the nine-nation committee adjourn without taking any action.

Just before the vote Morocco and the United Arab Republic declared they would not take part. They said they opposed any action in view of the decision by the UN General Assembly Wednesday night to suspend consideration of the Congo question until a 15-nation Asian-African conciliation commission tries to resolve rivalries between political factions in the Congo.

New Zealand, Spain, the Philippines, Costa Rica and Haiti voted for the U.S. resolution.

Those nations enabled the United States to beat back moves to keep Kasavubu waiting in the wings indefinitely as head of the Congo's delegation in the assembly.

Kasavubu, who arrived in New York earlier this week to take part in the debate, sent UN Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld a note accusing Ghana of "spreading irresponsible and false allegations" about the Congo situation.
