Students Predict Election Outcome

Ever wish you'd said "I told you so" before Kennedy or the Pirates won? Dr. David Russell, professor of education, gave his students and anyone else who wanted to try, that chance with the Nixon-Kennedy election.

Russell distributed a questionnaire asking for both popular and electoral vote predictions by state as well as the total estimate for the country.

Predicting the outcome of presidential elections has been Russell's hobby for the last three or four elections.

Knowing and understanding the electoral college system is important to a teacher in answering the many questions of students during election year. Russell also believes that his contest promotes political discussion in a professional, friendly way and discourages personal discussions.

How did Nixon and Kennedy fare in this contest? Russell admits he's never seen a wider range of opinion in one of his presidential election contests before. Popular vote counts ranged from 41,675,826 to 20,769,059 for Nixon and from 65,999,210 to 20,314,516 for Kennedy.

Edith Bloom, junior in elementary-kindergarten education from Curwensville just the most number of states correctly—41.

Imogene McIntyre, instructor in elementary education; Angela Saffko, junior in elementary-kindergarten education from Short Hills, N.J.; Judith Muskat, senior in elementary-kindergarten education from Newark, N.J.; Barbara Wasilnak, senior in electrical engineering from Scranton; and Paul VanBoon, junior in elementary-kindergarten education from Philadelphia came the closest to guessing the number of electoral votes for each candidate correctly. Their predictions ranged from 181 to 192 for Nixon and from 329 to 351 for Kennedy.
