

# Tough Army Squad Ready for Booters

Penn State's booters will be facing one of their toughest opponents of the year tomorrow when Army comes to University Park for a 10 a.m. game on Nittany Field.

The Black Knights are one of the big surprises in eastern soccer this year with a 7-1 record. All their wins came after an opening game loss to Brockport State Teachers.

The Cadets have beaten Ithaca, 5-1; NYU, 3-0; Rochester, 3-0; Rider College, 5-1; Yale, 4-1; Maryland, 3-1; and MIT, 2-0.

Their win over Maryland was the first loss for the Terps in 33 straight regular season games. State lost to the Terps, 4-1.

Last week, the Cadets ended another streak when they shut-out MIT, 2-0. It was the first time MIT had been shutout since 1955.

The Cadets' top scorer is Bev Powell. Powell started the season at center-forward and was held scoreless in the Brockport loss.

But in the Ithaca game he switched to left wing and the

Black Knight offense began to roll. Powell scored in seven straight games until MIT stopped him last week.

The main cog in the Army defense is halfback Fred Daniloff. Coach Joe Palone said that Daniloff plays the opposition's top scorer man to man. In the Maryland encounter Daniloff covered high scoring Carlos Martin, and held him scoreless.

Unlike the Cadets, State has had trouble on defense, allowing 19 goals in the first five games. But two weeks ago, the Lions held Navy scoreless for a 1-0 win and then last week they limited Temple's high powered offense to one goal for a 2-1 victory.

One reason for the Lions' improved defense is the play of fullbacks John Miller and Wayne Rodgers and goalie Dave Grubbs. Rodgers and Grubbs were hampered by early season injuries, but they will be in top form for tomorrow's encounter.

In the final game, Frank Slapikas led the Tricks to a 7-0 win over Air Force Institute.

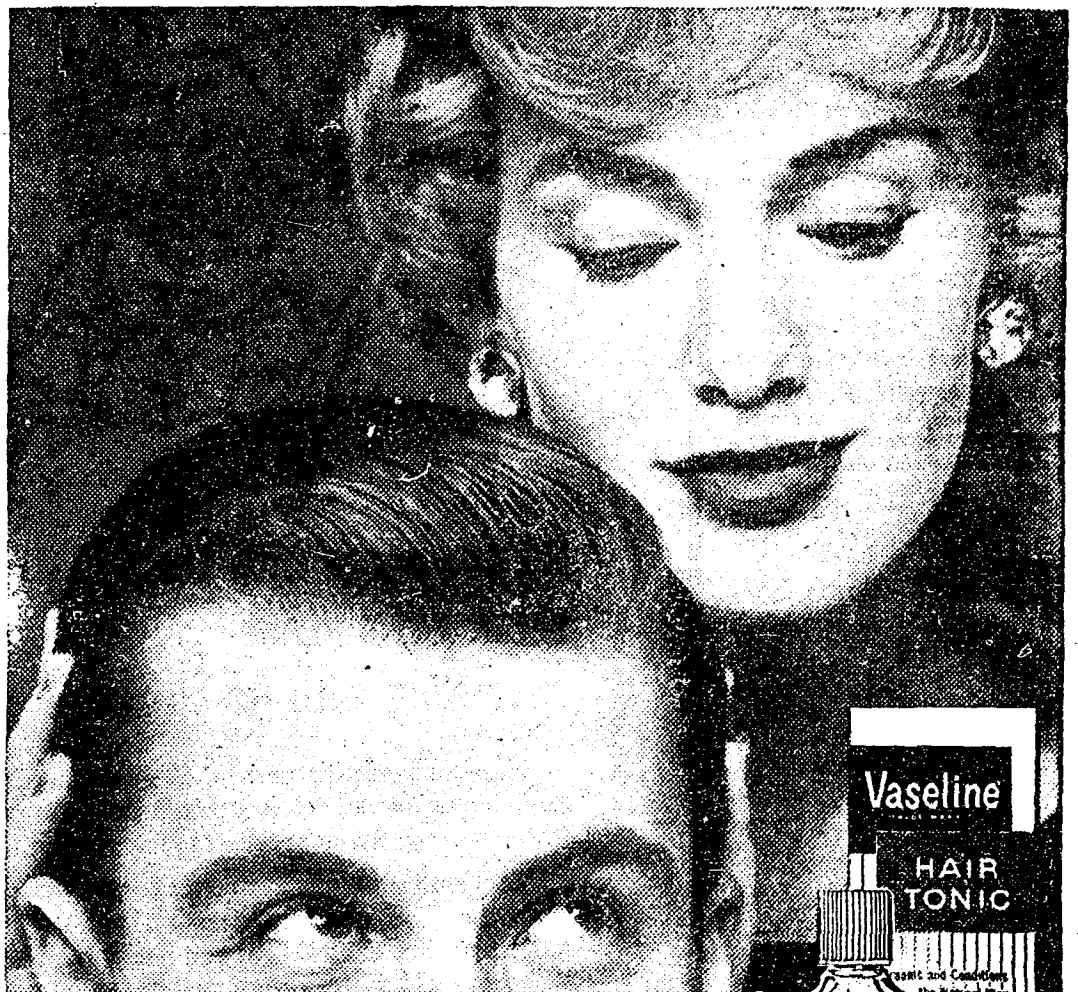
