

Marcel Marceau to Appear Sunday

Marcel Marceau, well-known French pantomimist, will present a program at 8 p.m. Sunday in Recreation Hall.

His performance is sponsored by the University Artists Series. Student ticket distribution will begin at 1:30 p.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk. Tickets for faculty and non-students will go on sale at 9 a.m. tomorrow.

The celebrated French artist will appear here on his third North American tour which began Sept. 6 with a record-breaking run at the New York City Center.

Marceau is known around the world as an interpreter of one of the oldest and least practiced of the performing arts—pantomime. He will present a program featuring his "Bip" sketches as well as some of the pantomimes with which American audiences are familiar, not only through the theatre, but also by way of television appearances such as the latest Dinah Shore Show.

Accompanying Marceau on his tour is Pierre Verry, who debuted with him in 1955 as "card holder" and was with him on his tour of the United States in 1958.

Marceau is visiting the United States after a year's sell-out run at the Ambigu Theatre in Paris, as well as a tour that took him to South America and the Near East.

Marceau compares the character, "Bip," to Buster Keaton's sailor.

"Bip has his adventures and misadventures with everything from butterflies to untameable lions to dance-hall girls," Marceau said.

IFCPA Sees Need For More Members

Methods discussed at the Interfraternity Council Encampment in September for publicizing the IFC Purchasing Agency and for increasing its membership led to a concerted effort on the part of IFCPA officers to sell the program to the fraternities at the IFC meeting last night.

The IFCPA acts as a purchasing agency which saves fraternities' money by buying wholesale and by obtaining discounts, Fred Phelps, IFCPA president explained. Member fraternities sign contracts to buy supplies only from the organization. Vendors, in turn agree to sell to IFCPA members at a discount and at a lower price than to non-members, he added.

Members pay \$15 a month to maintain the office services and also deposit into a sinking fund a sum equal to half their estimated food bill for one month at the beginning of the year.

IFCPA accepts bids from vendors for meat, canned goods, frozen food and produce, Phelps explained. Member fraternities order directly from the vendor or through the IFCPA.

Bills are sent by the vendor to the IFCPA. The member fraternities pay their bills through the organization in a manner similar to the use of a checking account, he added.

At present only 21 fraternities belong to the system which also provides household supplies and coal. If more fraternities join the system, the month-

ly fee may be reduced and the discounts given by the vendors would probably increase, Phelps said.

Substantial savings can be made by each house which will lower their total cost of operation considerably, he added.

IFCPA is run by a board of directors composed of a student board, a non-graduate board, and a manager, Mrs. Carolyn Cheney. Student members of the board are Fred Phelps, Phi Kappa Tau, president; Carter Becker, Acacia, vice president; James Fenstermacher, Phi Kappa Tau, secretary-treasurer; Frank Siegrist, Delta Upsilon; Robert Maclean, Delta Chi.

The Pennsylvania Forestry Association voted to meet in State College in June, 1961, to commemorate its 75th anniversary. It is the oldest association of its kind in the United States.

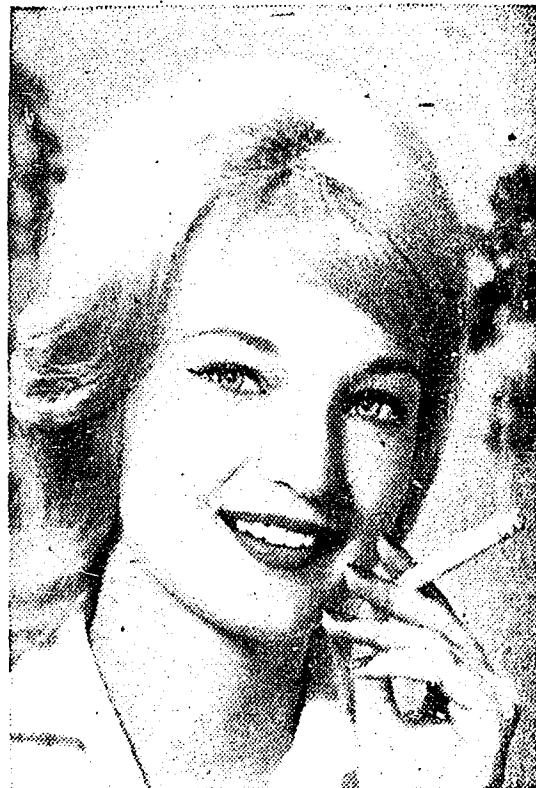
