

Lions Capture Fifth Victory

(Continued from page one) by the Boston writers who have grown accustomed to Ivy League line play, was in on a majority of Penn State's tackles and he always seemed to come up with the key play whenever the Crusaders were on the march.

Although the score indicated a complete romp, that wasn't the case.

Holy Cross didn't let up for a minute as gambling Pat McCarthy filled the airwaves with 29 passes.

The Crusader sophomore completed 12 for 171 yards and was just three yards behind Hoak who had a magnificent afternoon with six completions in seven attempts for 174 yards.

In addition to McCarthy, Holy Cross unleashed another talented sophomore — halfback Tom Hennessey.

Playing with an injured leg, Hennessey still managed to gain 39 yards in 10 carries.

"Hennessey and McCarthy are outstanding football players and they should get better," Lion Coach Rip Engle enthused after the game.

"Holy Cross was a spirited team that was upset-minded, and our boys really had to battle," Engle said.

Quarterback Coach Joe Paterno agreed. "They have a real young, rugged football team," Paterno said, "but they were their own worst enemies and made a lot of mistakes."

Holy Cross' weakest point was its pass defense and the Lions capitalized on it from the beginning with Hoak doing most of the damage.

The Lions launched their first touchdown drive midway in the opening period from their own 47.

An 11-yard pass from Hoak to Dave Truitt and a 33-yarder from Hoak to Dave Robinson consumed most of the yardage.

Robinson was brought down on the seven-yard line by Al Snyder and four plays later Al Gursky scored from the one to make it 6-0. Henry Oppermann's extra point try failed.

Usually a guard, Robinson was playing end because John Bozick

and Dave Alexander were sidelined with injuries.

State made it 14-0 shortly after the second period began.

This drive covered 76 yards in nine plays with Jim Kerr following Galen Hall and Don Jonas around left end for the score.

State added two points on the conversion when Hall pitched to Jonas who threw on the run to Bob Mitinger in the end zone.

The Lions came close to scoring just before the half ended. Hoak was on the 35 when he spotted Dick Pae in the clear downfield on the Holy Cross 25.

Hoak lifed a beautiful lead pass for little Richard who went to the nine before Hennessey nailed him. The play covered 56 yards.

The Lions moved to the one but Hoak fumbled the snap from center on fourth down and Holy Cross took over.

A Hall to Truitt touchdown pass which covered seven yards gave State a 20-0 lead with 4:40 gone in the third period.

Later in the quarter with the ball on the Holy Cross 28, Hoak threw another feathery lead pass to Pae who just managed to get behind the Crusader defenders for Penn State's fourth TD.

The score remained 26-0 when Pae missed the extra point.

Holy Cross' lone touchdown drive came after State's fourth score.

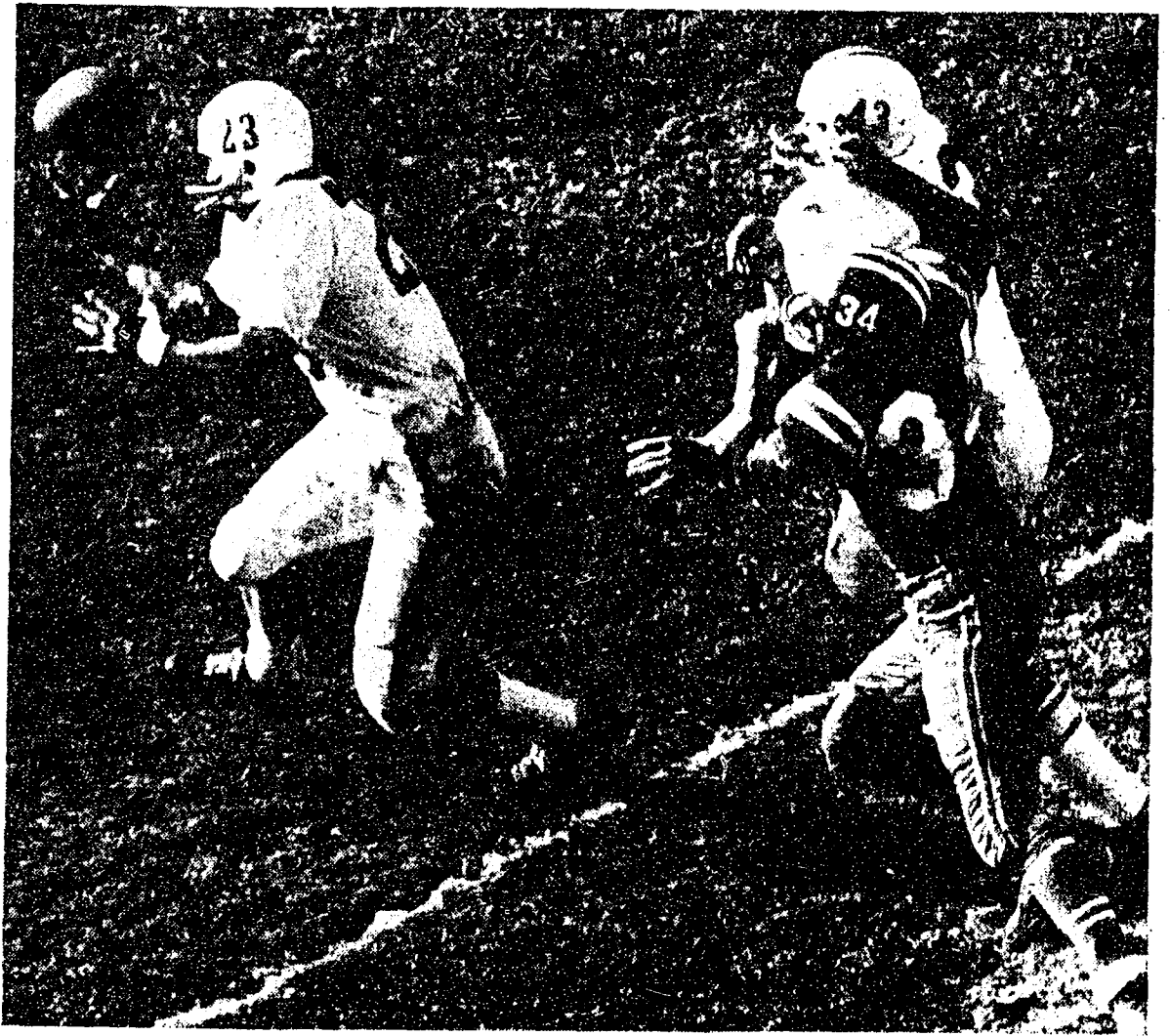
With McCarthy directing the offense, the Crusaders marched 57 yards in 11 plays. With the ball on the six, halfback Dick Skinner dashed to his left, got blocks from Hennessey and Kevin Malone and scored to make it 26-6. McCarthy added the two extra points on a roll out.

State's final touchdown came minutes later when fullback Dave Hayes carried over from the one to make it 32-8. Jonas booted the PAT for the final margin of 33-8.

An 18-yard run by Hoak and a 23-yard pass play from Hoak to Jim Schwab were the key plays in the 67-yard drive.

The Lions enjoyed a wide edge in most of the statistics.

They outscored the Crusaders, 238-99, and outpassed them, 215-171. Both teams were even in first downs.
