

AAH Professor To Talk Friday

Martin Weinberger, distinguished visiting professor in art and architectural history, will speak at 8 p.m. Friday in the Hetzel Union assembly room.

Weinberger will lecture on "Connoisseurship and Forgery in the Fine Arts."

A recognized authority in this field Weinberger has built up a large collection of photographs and slides of forgeries over the years and will use them in his talk.

He received his doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Munich and studied for several years in England before coming to this country. He has taught in London and Edinburgh and in this country at the University of Pennsylvania and Swarthmore College.

For the last 15 years he has been professor of art history at the Institute of Fine Arts, the Graduate School of Art History at New York University.

He has published seven books and more than fifty articles and reviews in the field of Medieval and Renaissance art.
