

# Delta Sig, Westmoreland Take IM Football Crowns

Delta Sigma Phi and Westmoreland House captured the fraternity and Independent I.M. football crowns last night.

Delta Sig clipped Phi Gamma Delta, 3-0, on the strength of an early field goal by Dick Cunningham.

Westmoreland edged fellow North Halls finalist, Berks House, 1-0 on a 3-1 lead in first downs.

Delta Sig started its scoring drive with an interception on the Phi Gam thirty early in the game.

A series of Cunningham passes to big Jon Musser and little Chuck DiPuppo moved Delta Sig to the Phi Gam 12.

With a fourth down situation coming up, Cunningham lined a perfect field goal through the uprights to give Delta Sig a lead it stubbornly held for the remaining 33 minutes.

Phi Gam took Cunningham's kickoff on the 10, and from there they mounted a drive that went all the way to the Delta Sig 22.

Skip Finkleston, one of the top quarterbacks in the I.M. ranks, sparked the attack with passes to Bob Snyder and Jim Ottinger. A fourth down "must" pass from the 22 was dropped, and Delta Sig took over to halt the threat.

Early in the second half, Ottinger attempted a fourth down field goal from the 48 with the wind to his back, but it fell short.

Minutes later he tried again when a Phi Gam attack was stalled on the 21, but this time his kick sailed wide of the uprights.

With less than a minute to go, and the ball on the Phi Gam 30-yard line, Finkleston let go with a long homerun pass that was intercepted on the 15 by DiPuppo. Delta Sig then ran out the clock for the victory.

The Westmoreland-Berks game turned out to be a battle of interceptions, but it was Westmoreland's concentration on the short

pass and the first down that brought home the victory.

Once again, it was the red-hot combination of Angelo Paolletti to Wendy Wear that sparked the Westmoreland attack.

However, Westmoreland's closest penetration was to Berk's 18-yard line late in the first half. Here, Tom Shaffer of Berks came through with one of his three interceptions to stop the threat.

Early in the second half, Berks mounted its only threat after a Shaffer interception on Westmoreland's 38-yard line. Passes

# Missouri Moves Into First In Weekly AP Football Poll

Only Kansas, an arch rival since 1891, stands in the way of Missouri's first perfect football season.

For the first time, Missouri was ranked No. 1 yesterday in the weekly Associated Press college poll, and a victory Saturday over Kansas might mean a first national championship for the Tigers.

Missouri, with a 9-0 record for its third season under Coach Dan Devine, is a touchdown favorite over Kansas (6-2-1) in its final game Saturday at Columbia, Mo.

The Tigers have an opportunity to wrap up the Big Eight Conference title and get a crack at an Orange Bowl opponent in Miami Jan. 2. Last New Year's Day, Georgia beat Missouri in the Orange Bowl, 14-0.

The 48-man panel of sports

writers and sportscasters gave Missouri a landslide 34 first place votes in this week's nationwide poll after the Tigers smashed Oklahoma 41-19 and Minnesota was beaten 23-14 by Purdue.

Minnesota, the No. 1 club for one week, skidded to fourth place behind Iowa, No. 2, and Mississippi, No. 3.

Iowa, leading the Big Ten race after smashing Ohio State Saturday 35-12, ends its season this week against Notre Dame. Mississippi, heading the Southeastern Conference scramble, has an open date, awaiting Mississippi State Nov. 26.

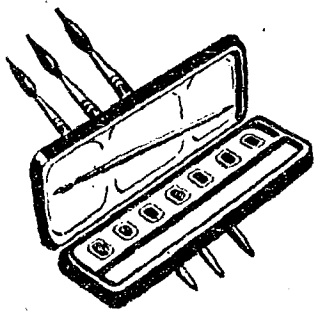

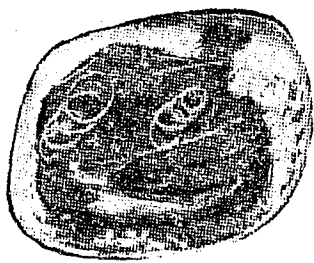
