

Diem Vetoes TIM Suggestion On Commuter Parking Lots

Albert E. Diem, vice president for business administration, has turned down the Town Independent Men's Council suggestion to open two parking lots nearer the center of campus for commuter use, Robert Fry reported to the council Wednesday night.

Diem, Fry said, felt the small distance saved for the commuters would not warrant the confusion of the changeover.

Fry has been investigating parking conditions for commuting students for the council. He said he would continue to keep in touch with the Student Government Association's Traffic Code Investigation Committee and would report to the council on its activities.

TIM Council president Philip Haines said that SGA Cabinet has

approved a seat for TIM. The measure cannot, however, go before Assembly until TIM's autonomy is okayed by the Senate, he said.

TIM executive committee members would rotate in attending the cabinet meetings.

In other business, Ken Patla reported on the Independent Student Association's "Project Joey." About 80 orphans will be brought to the University for a Christmas party, dinner and other entertainment.
