

Soccermen Meet Pitt Tomorrow

The Penn State booters close out their 1960 season at 10:30 tomorrow morning against Pitt on the Panthers' home field.

The Lions blew their chances for a winning season last Saturday when Army right wing Bev Powell scored all three goals to give the Cadets a 3-1 victory. State's record is 3-5.

Pitt goes into tomorrow's encounter with a 4-5-1 slate. Two weeks ago the Panthers ended West Chester's eight game winning streak by holding the Rams to a 1-1 tie and last week they defeated Lock Haven, 4-2.

State lost to West Chester, 5-1, but downed Lock Haven in a practice game, 6-0.

The Panthers have seven lettermen back from last year's squad that downed State, 1-0, including George Zanicopulos, an honorable mention All-American goalie last year.

Zanicopulos should have a peaceful afternoon if the Lions continue to throw away scoring chances like they did against Army Saturday.

While State's offense has been dragging, the Lion defensive corps has improved greatly since the beginning of the season.

In the last three games they shutout Navy, held highpowered Temple to one goal, and except for a great effort by Powell, stopped Army cold.

The game will be played on the field directly opposite the Pitt Field House.

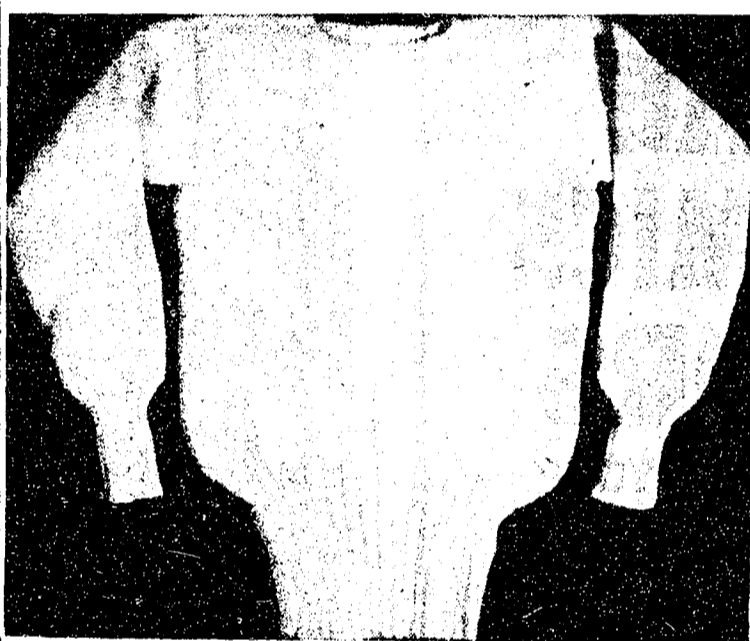
