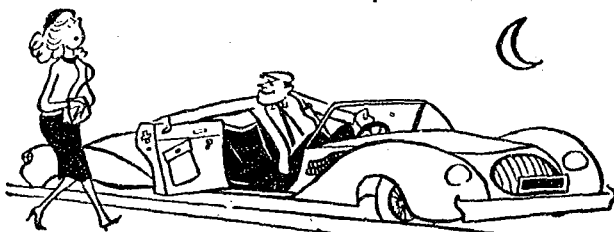
DEAR STRAIT: Drop your handkerchief.
