

Collegian Places 1st For Sports

For the second straight year The Daily Collegian was awarded first place in the sports writing division of the student newspaper contest conducted annually by Sigma Delta Chi, professional journalistic society.

A first place award for radio reporting was won by John Truby, '60, and a first place for radio or TV newswriting or commentary was awarded to Jim Jimarro, Tom Haskell and Agnes Armon of Penn State.

Citations were presented last week at the national convention of Sigma Delta Chi in New York City to Robert Taczlosky, senior in journalism from Mahanoy City, who was the official delegate of the Penn State SDX chapter.

The Penn State chapter fell two points short of winning the 1960 Beckman Award. This award is given each year to the chapter judged to have carried out the best professional journalistic program.

The University of Wisconsin chapter won the award with 92 points. Penn State was second with 90 points.

H. Eugene Goodwin, director of the School of Journalism, was elected director of Region One under a change instituted by the convention which divided the country into 11 regions for better chapter coordination.

Annual Safety Check Approved by IFC

Yearly safety inspection of fraternity houses was approved by the Interfraternity Council at its meeting last night.

The IFC also introduced a proposal to improve fraternity scholarship.

Ronald Novak, president of IFC, called for a vote on the safety proposal which states that there will be a yearly inspection of fraternity houses by the house manager, a member of the IFC safety committee and the borough fire marshal to make sure the houses are safe.

According to the motion, the house manager will be notified two weeks prior to the inspection and will be given a check list of points being examined.

Gerald Logue, chairman of the Scholarship Committee, introduced a proposal which is aimed toward improving fraternity scholarship.

According to this proposal, which will be voted on at the next meeting, a fraternity that falls below the all-men's average for more than two terms will be required to make two reports to the scholarship committee and will receive assistance for establishing a scholarship improvement program.

A fraternity who is below the all-men's average for more than four consecutive terms will lose certain social privileges, such as participation in Greek Week, Spring Week and will be limited to one social event per week.

Dean Wilmer E. Wise, advisor of IFC, said that the scholarship proposal is another needed addition to the IFC system and that the fraternities should make every effort to improve their average.
