

# Improving Cagers Will Face Blue Devils, Wake Forest

The pessimistic outlook that hung over the Penn State basketball team a few weeks ago is slowly turning to optimism following two straight wins over Purdue and Lehigh.

However, with Duke and Wake Forest coming up in Charlotte, N.C., this weekend, no one—especially coach John Egli—is making any predictions.

"The progress we have made since the Maryland game has been tremendous," Egli said yesterday.

"The boys have realized that if they play smart, cautious ball, they have a chance against anyone. We have to play our game," Egli continued, "and we have to make the other team come to us."

Since losing to Maryland, 64-47, at College Park a week ago, the Lions have topped Purdue, 63-59, and Lehigh 66-50 Tuesday night.

Against Purdue Mark DuMars, State's All-American guard candidate, was the big star with 31 points but at Lehigh he only scored six.

So, much to everybody's surprise, the rest of the starting lineup came through with double figures and the Lions walked home with an easy win.

Lean Gene Harris, with 19 points and sophomore Earl Hoffman with 14, were the top scorers against the Engineers while Jake Trueblood had 12 and John Mitchell had 10.

"If we play the way we did against Purdue and Lehigh, I think we'll do OK down there this weekend," Egli said.

## Braves Get Bolling For Bruton, 3 Others

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Milwaukee landed second baseman Frank Bolling and Detroit acquired center-fielder Billy Bruton in a major interleague deal involving six players yesterday.

To get the second baseman they have been chasing for over a year, the Braves gave up Bruton, second baseman Chuck Cottier, catcher Dick Brown and rookie relief pitcher Terry Fox.

In addition to Bolling, Milwaukee will get an "acceptable minor league player" to be designated before March 1.

"We've been working since the 1959 World Series to get Bolling," said John McHale, Milwaukee general manager who formerly held the same job at Detroit.

"When I was with Detroit I thought Bolling was as valuable as Harvey Kuenn or Al Kaline. He is a high class, first division type player, a fine hustler and excellent team man."

The Braves also acquired another second baseman, Billy Martin, from Cincinnati in a \$40,000 purchase Saturday. Martin now figures for utility work, apparently.

Bob Scheffing, new Detroit manager, said he will return Al Kaline to his old post in right field, play Bruton in center and use Rocky Colavito in left field. Kaline prefers right field.

# Final Statistics Show Lions, Oregon Even

Final statistics show that Penn State and Oregon will be two of the most evenly matched bowl teams in the nation.

The Lions and Oregon will meet in the second annual Liberty Bowl game in Philadelphia Stadium next weekend.

Penn State scored 187 points in nine games (6-3), while Len Casanova's Webfoots rolled up 194 in 10.

State recorded 160 first downs, Oregon—which had a 7-2-1 log—totaled 166. State gained 2914 yards, Oregon 3311.

In rushing yardage, the Ducks accumulated 2281 to an even 2000 for State. The Lions gained 914 through the air to 1030 for the northwesterners.

The Lions, led by quarterbacks Galen Hall and Dick Hoak, connected on 68 of 147 passes and had 11 intercepted. Oregon, powered by Dave Grosz, 14th best in the country in total offense, hit on 66 of 163 with 13 interceptions. Grosz is a draftee of the Philadelphia Eagles.

With Hall, Hoak and Grosz almost 50 per cent accurate, the Liberty Bowl clash may see a lot of passing.

West Virginia, the lone common opponent of both State and Oregon, reports that "Liberty Bowl fans may see the best football match of all the bowls." Mountaineer publicist Ed Barrett says "Penn State is the best football team we played this year. But, Oregon by far was the most colorful."

State thumped the Mountaineers 34-13 at Beaver Stadium, while the Ducks scored a 20-6 win at Portland.

## Kearns, Teamsters Seek Ring Control

WASHINGTON (AP) — Veteran boxing manager Jack Kearns testified yesterday he is negotiating with the Teamsters Union on organizing the entire prize fight industry.

Kearns told Senate probes his most recent negotiations with the Teamsters took place within the past two weeks.

He said he is dickering also with the AFL-CIO through its president, George Meany.

The AFL-CIO has expelled the Teamsters on the basis of findings in another Senate investigation that some top Teamsters officials have been allied with gangsters.

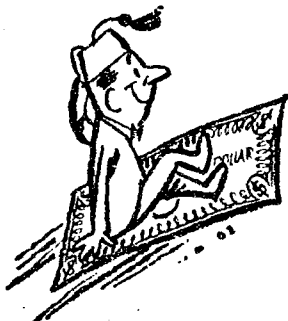
