

AWS Guest Will Visit University

The Association of Women Students executive board voted last night to sponsor an AWS International Guest in Residence.

The guest, Miss Kirsten Holm of Sweden, will be at the University Monday through Thursday of next week.

Miss Holm, who is a teacher and a member of her country's 1948 Olympic gym team, will have dinner with the various community councils during her stay. Following the dinners she will be available for fireside chats in the respective communities.

The board also discussed the AWS Freshman Tea which will be held from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday in the Pollock Dining Area recreation room.

The tea is sponsored by the AWS freshmen senators, Roberta Fuerstein and Judith Allen, and freshman members of the several community councils.

"The purpose of the tea is to enable upperclass women and freshmen to become acquainted and to create a feeling of unity among freshman women," the freshmen senators said.

The theme of the tea this year is "Abstract Christmas," which is in keeping with the modern atmosphere of the Pollock Area, they added.

Newman concluded saying that if the Liberal Party will abide by the recommendations of the committee they will get a charter.

In reply to these objections, Snyder said he felt that he and Flashman presented a reasonable attitude and were not disrespectful to the sub-committee.

He further disputed the right of a committee to consider the attitude of certain representatives in granting a group charter.

WUS Starts 1960 Drive For Funds

World University Service, commonly known as WUS, has inaugurated its annual fund drive, which will be conducted until Dec. 18.

Patricia McGee and Janet Goodman, co-chairman of WUS, announced that letters explaining the objectives of the drive have been sent to most organizations on campus plus all fraternities and sororities.

WUS, which sponsors the Professor Snarf contest on campus, is an international organization through which American students aid students in other lands by health and medical services, books and supplies, self-help projects and individual and emergency aid.

For the contest, which is held in the spring, each college nominates a professor as the outstanding one on campus. The pictures are placed with large jars and students vote for their choice by contributing pennies to WUS.

Miss McGee and Miss Goodman said that through the contest, WUS has been able to contribute funds for many students in foreign countries.

Home Ec Ed Spreads to Asia

With the aid of a retired Penn State professor, studies of home economics are spreading to the women of South East Asia.

Three new home economics buildings have been erected at the Taiwan Provincial Normal University in Formosa with the aid of Dr. Jean D. Amberson, professor emeritus of home economics education. Dr. Amberson spent two years in Taiwan developing home economics education.

The China Home Economics Association was officially organized and a constitution adopted through the help of Dr. Amberson. She is now on another two-year assignment with the United States Operation Missions to Thailand. These

"Projects for Peace" programs are sponsored by the International Cooperation Administration.

Dr. Amberson assisted in the writing of a pamphlet for teachers on the homemaking program in the home, school and community. She also aided in the publication of three other pamphlets on child care of middle school pupils.

Planning music programs, folk dances and lectures added to the varied experience of Dr. Amberson during her two years in Taiwan. She participated on the Committee for Services to Families and assisted in the distribution of Christmas gifts to children in homes and in refugee centers on Formosa.

In her present two-year assignment in the area of Thailand, Dr. Amberson will act as regional advisor of home economics education. She will be working in teacher education directly with teachers, administrators and ministries in South Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand and Laos.

Eventually her home base will be in Laos, but if political affairs are not settled there within a reasonable amount of time, her headquarters will probably be in Bangkok.
