

Workshop Discusses Pledging

(This is the second article in a series on recommendations from the second annual Panhellenic workshop held this fall.)

The main statement that resulted from the Pledge Trainers' Workshop, according to Sandra Sligh, chairman, was that the sororities as a whole do not require too much of their pledges.

For the purpose of unity among the pledge class, Miss Sligh said, most sororities require the pledges to spend a certain number of hours a week in the sorority suite. While in the suite, the pledges are to become acquainted with the sisters, to study and to perform small jobs within the suite.

Other duties of the pledge, as defined by the workshop, are to work for a good average, participate in sorority and campus activities and take part in the sorority "inspiration" or "help" week.

In answer to the complaint of

pledges that they spend more time than the sisters on sorority activities such as Spring Week, the workshop urged the sisters to work together with the pledges on this type of project.

The workshop found that both formal and informal pledge meetings were used by the various sororities. Several sororities felt, according to Miss Sligh, that the formal pledge meetings prepared the pledges for chapter meetings which are always held with formal procedures.

Pledges are urged to maintain good averages. Miss Sligh said, even though most sororities initiate the same semester as pledging and the pledges are not required to achieve a particular average to be initiated.

To assist the pledge with her introduction to sorority life, each sorority has a big-little sister or a mother-daughter program. The workshop recommended that the sororities set up a special committee for the purpose of pairing the big and little sisters.
