In order to eliminate the human element of error, Stanford said, machines are used to process and code the information. Final decisions, however, are not made merely on the basis of machine computations, Stanford

The University is currently studying new methods of judging applicants' qualifications. Currently rank in high school class and College Board aptitude tests of all except those in the top 20 per cent of their class are used as criteria for decisions on appli-

The high school courses which the applicant has taken are also coded to determine the curriculum for which he is qualified to be admitted. If the student lacks some requirement for his desired curriculum, he is notified.

In addition to this information, the University is attempting to find a way to account for dif-ferences in the quality of high

Another study deals with the record of the number of students who go to college from a given high school. It also seeks to de-termine whether the students from the high school which sends more graduates to college may also be the source of more qualified applicants.

A third study is concerned with grades in high school English. Since English is considered a basic skill in college work, the study will try to determine whether high school grades in English can be indicative of success.




