

Forum Debates SGA Future

The feasibility of a full-time executive secretary for the Student Government Association was questioned along with other proposals dealing with the future of student government by student leaders on WDFM's Forum of the Air last night.

An executive secretary to be hired and fired by SGA and who would represent the interests of the student body in dealing with the administration was recommended in a letter to be submitted to SGA tonight by John Brandt, senior in physics from Rochester, N.Y.

Brandt's plan was criticized by Walter Darran, majority party leader, who felt it took SGA from the students. Brandt in turn said that his plan called

for someone to represent student interest as opposed to the present SGA advisors who, having been appointed by the administration, represent its interests.

Another objection was noted by Richard Goldberg, WDFM staff member, in the lack of a definite plan to finance such a venture. Brandt felt that salary would not be a difficulty in view of the \$5000 already allotted to SGA for its officers, encampment and operation of elections.

Also discussed was Darran's resolution to give SGA the power to voice its opinion on local, national and international affairs.

Darran felt these matters came within SGA's main emphasis of service to students because student interest in off-campus issues has already been expressed in groups such as

DARE and the student body.

Brandt conditionally supported Darran's proposal saying that it only showed the poor state of student government when it became necessary to put such suggestions into legislation.

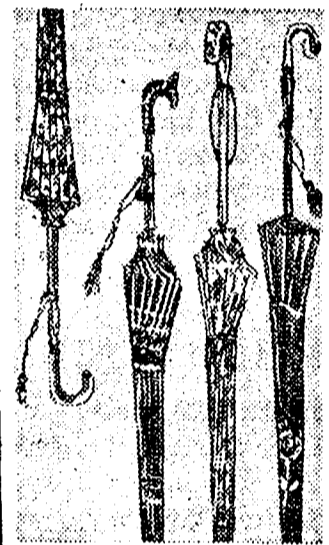

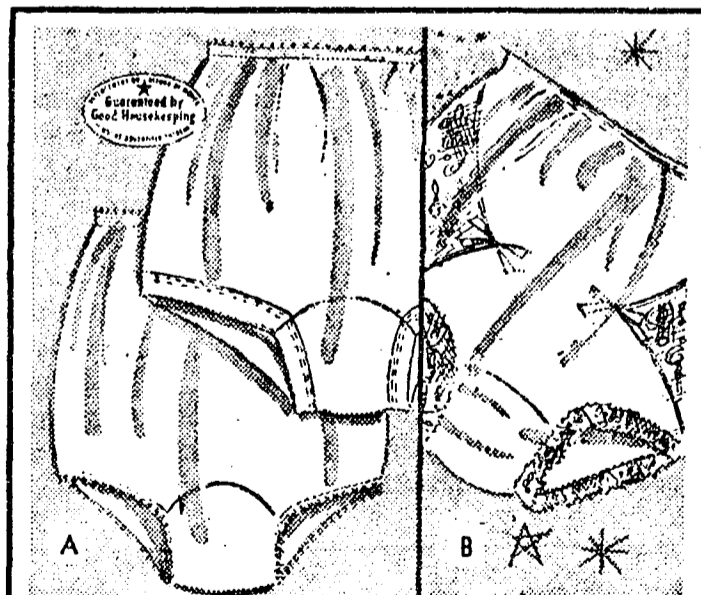
