

Barnett Ranks as Top Soph Lineman in West

Ask Len Casanova about Steve Barnett, Oregon's huge right tackle, and he'll tell you that his Ducks have the best sophomore lineman in the West.

Barnett, a growing 235-pounder, compiled more honors than most of the Oregon vets this fall as the Ducks compiled a 7-2-1 record.

He made every All-West coast team, was picked on everyone of Oregon's all opponent squads and turned out to be the best offensive and defensive lineman on the team.

"Steve is a big, strong boy who really loves to play football," Casanova said yesterday after deplaning in Philadelphia for Saturday's Liberty Bowl battle against Penn State.

"He's amazingly fast, for his size," Casanova continued, "and he never wants to come out."

"He averaged over 40 minutes a game and that easily could have been higher if we had allowed him to stay in."

"He's going to be real trouble for Penn State Saturday, believe me."

In addition to Barnett, Casanova has some other exceptional linemen.

Co-Captain Dave Urell, the right guard, was named to the All-West teams, too, and he'll play in the East-West Shrine game in San Francisco, Dec. 31.

The swift, rugged senior has been a standout regular for the Webfoots the past two years.

Oregon is well fortified at end with Paul Bauge, a two-year letterman, and Len Burnett.

Bauge, named to the scholastic All-American team, is a fine blocker, a crack defensive man, and an adequate receiver.

Burnett, on the other hand, is an exceptional receiver with

plenty of speed. He gathered in 10 passes during the year for 207 yards.

In reserve the Ducks have Jerry Tarr, another speedster. Tarr just missed an Olympic high hurdle berth last summer.

Ron Snidow, a 6-3, 218 pound soph, will join Barnett at tackle and scrappy Mike Rose will start at left guard for Oregon.

The Duck center will be Joe Clesceri who goes 6-1, 205.

A hawk on defense, Clesceri is rated as one of the best defensive pivotmen in the West.

Capetola used a vicious series of hooks to floor his opponent before the referee stepped in and stopped the fight.

Mort Cross of Phi Epsilon Pi stopped Bill Brown of Tau Phi Delta at 0:35 of the third round to gain the 176-pound finals.

A second round TKO gave Phil Kreitner of Tau Kappa Epsilon another crack at a championship crown. Kreitner defeated Mike Rech of Phi Epsilon Pi.
