

# MI Groups Will Vote On 'Honesty'

The departments of Petroleum and Natural Gas Engineering and Mining Engineering voted on the academic honesty program, Gene Grumer, president of the Mineral Industrial Student Council, reported at a meeting Tuesday night.

Results of the voting will not be announced for several days, he said.

The council has backed the honor system for three years. Elections were held last year in three of the 11 MI curriculums. The Departments of Mineral Preparation, Fuel Technology, and Geophysics-Geochemistry have already adopted the program.

The council voted at the meeting to donate \$25 to buy a blazer for a Russian gymnast, Kay Carpenter, sophomore in meteorology from Martinsville, N.J., will present the blazer following the gym meet Saturday.

Several changes in the council's constitution were read which will ease operation on a three term basis. One change involved lowering the quorum from 19 to 15 council members so that more business can be acted upon.

(Continued from page five) be an integral part of this system, Miss Hamm said, for each chapter will be permitted to rush until it fulfills the quota, although it is not obligated to do so.

Since it will be increasingly difficult under the four-term system to predict the number graduating or dropping out of each sorority during the year, the pledge quota will be made flexible to allow for this, she explained. The system also allows small chapters to build up their size by pledging a class over and above the quota as long as it does not exceed the chapter limitation, she said.

The National Panhellenic Committee on College Panhellenics gives the following reasons for recommending the system:

●The plan has proved a workable device for campuses concerned with inequality in chapter size where, without the system, there is a tendency for the larger groups to grow larger and the small to grow smaller.

●The system can create an increased respect for sororities on campus by eliminating "cutthroat competition" and promoting friendly cooperation.
