The modern history of the or-chestra began in 1926 when a group of theater musicians, determined to build an orchestra for their city, formed an orchestra to recognize the first group.

Under the direction of Edward Spector, this group financed themselves privately and gradually picked up more and more support as the people of Pittsburgh began to realize the advantages of a symphony orchestra. By 1937 the Pittsburgh Sym-

phony Orchestra had firmly established themselves by successfully challenging the "blue laws" which had prevented the sale of tickets on Sunday.

Following four seasons of guest conductors, the present director, William Steinberg, came to Pitts-burgh to conduct the orchestra.
