## Stevenson Sees No Congo Policy

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (PP)-American and Soviet delegates made clear yesterday that their countries were still far apart on what the United Nations should do in the Congo despite a two-hour conference on the subject.
U.S. Chief Delegate Adlai E. Stevenson told a reporter the conference at Soviet delegation headquarters Monday night made him hopeful but "not at all eventual Soviet-U.S. agreement on how to settle the Congo crisis.
Soviet Deputy Foreign Min. ister Valerion A. Zorin declazed that such agreement "depends first of all upon a real change in the position of the United States."
He said he did not see that the United States was seriously re"Perhaps," he added, "they are held by their allies."
