

SGA Compiles List Of Town Housing

A non-discriminatory town housing list, set up by the Student Government Association, has replaced a list maintained by the dean of men's office and is now the only list in use.

This list, posted on a bulletin board next to the HUB desk before final exams, was compiled by the SGA Committee on Interracial Problems.

SGA was granted permission to take over the old dean of men's housing list by President Eric A. Walker. The dean of men's list was then discontinued.

The new list now contains the names of over 200 landlords who are willing to rent rooms to students on a non-discriminatory basis.

The list was compiled as a result of a bill passed by SGA Assembly on Oct. 27. It was suggested in the bill that "SGA maintain a housing list conditional upon the landlord's practice of

non-discrimination by race, creed, color, religion or national origin."

It was further stated in the bill that "any landlord found upon due investigation to practice discrimination shall no longer be registered by SGA until such time as there is evidence of a change of policy."

According to the bill, the SGA Committee on Interracial Problems was authorized to conduct a campaign to encourage landlords to rent rooms to students on a non-discriminatory basis.

Any landlord wishing to place his house or rooms on the list may call UN 5-4952 between 1 and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.
