

# Navy Matmen Beat Lions, 17-11

Navy gained three decisions and a tie in the last four matches to hand the Penn State wrestling team its third loss of the season at Annapolis, Md., Saturday, 17-11.

John Trojan (167), Phil Myer (177) and Dave Hayes (191) lost the decisions and Lion co-captain Johnston Oberly was held to a 2-2 draw by Navy's undefeated heavyweight, John Griffith.

State could manage only three decisions over the underrated Middies. Denny Slattery won his match at 123, co-captain Jerry Seckler pulled out of a two-match losing streak with a one-point verdict at 147 and Ron Pifer won his fifth match of the season at 157.

Milt Brubaker, making his varsity debut at 137 in place of Dan Johnston, who was sidelined with tonsillitis, lost a 5-0, shut-out and Tony Scordo (130) lost for the third time this year against four victories.

Slattery put State out in front for the sixth time in seven starts this season with a takedown, two reversals and riding time for a 7-4 decision over Navy's John Eller.

Gary Thomas scored a first period takedown over Scordo and was never headed. Thomas scored twice more on takedowns and gained three points for a near fall on his way to a 10-6 win.

Navy's Mike Harman defeated Brubaker, 5-0, on a first-period takedown, a third period reversal and a point for riding time.

Seckler scored five points in the opening period on a takedown, a reversal and a one-point predicament and staved off a late rally by Bob Smith for a 7-6 decision. Smith scored all his points on reversals.

Pifer stopped John McGrath's unbeaten streak with a 2-0 win. The Lion junior used a second period escape and riding time to gain the decision.

Pete Nelson scored three points in the second period to erase Trojan's 2-0 lead and added a point for riding time to make the final score 4-2.

Navy captain Dick Royston outscored Phil Myer, 3-2, in the last period to gain an 8-5 win at

177. Myer was behind, 5-3, going into the last stanza.

Hayes, a sophomore who has been practicing with the team only a short while, was held to a second period escape by Tom Uber. Meanwhile Uber was racking up seven points on two takedowns, an escape, a predicament point and riding time.

Oberly scored a first-period takedown but that was as far as he could go. Griffith rode him for the entire second stanza and then pulled an escape in the final pe-

riod. A point for riding time knotted the score at 2-2.

Navy is now 5-2. State (4-3) will be at Syracuse Saturday.
