

Lion Trackmen Defeat Navy

Sparkling performances by five sophomores helped Penn State's track team gain a 59 3/5 - 40 2/5 victory over Navy at Annapolis Saturday.

Gerry Norman, Howie Deardorff, Bob Grantham, Ciro Risoldi, and Ron McAlevy, all first year men on the varsity, came through in the clutch as Penn State won its first indoor dual meet since 1947. That year the Lions beat Notre Dame at South Bend, Ind.

Navy started the afternoon off in ominous fashion, grabbing all three places in the shot put. But State came on strong to take eight firsts, and tie for another. The Lions set two Field House records and equaled another in the process.

There were many heroes for State. Norman won both the mile and two mile runs. Bob Brown tied a Field House record with a time of 6.2 in the 60-yard dash. Deardorff and Steve Moorhead won decisively in the 1000 and 600 respectively.

But the biggest surprises were McAlevy and Jerry Wettstone.

McAlevy cut three seconds off his previous best time in the quarter-mile Saturday when he was clocked in 50.3 for the second leg in the mile relay. Sate won

in 3:20.1 to set a Field House record.

Wettstone had never cleared better than six feet in competition before Saturday when he tied teammate Dick Campbell for first place in the high jump with an effort of 6-4 1/2.

State's two-mile relay team (Deardorff, Moorhead, Mike Miller and Fred Larson) also set a Field House record by beating Navy in 7:48.5. The old mark was 7:50.2, set by Penn State's quartet of Chick King, Dick Engelbrink, Ed Moran and Herm Weber in 1959.

Norman's time for the two-mile was 9:27.5. Ernie Noll, a senior who usually specializes in the 880, ran the longer distance for the first time and finished second in 9:35.

Norman won the mile with a clocking of 4:18.2 followed by Weber and Navy's Bernie Fleming.

Moorhead ran the first 600 of his life and won with a very respectable clocking of 1:12.1. George Marienthal was second and State's Don Davies third.

Deardorff won the 1000 in 2:13.2, one of the fastest times for that event recorded in the East so far this season.

Dale Peters, a senior and Risoldi hit 13 feet in the pole vault to gain a five-way tie for first with three Navy vaulters.

Grantham placed second in the broad jump behind Navy's Scot Thorell.
