

Colgate Uses Fast Break To Defeat Cagers, 80-72

Hamilton, N.Y., Feb. 17 — Fast-breaking Colgate took advantage of Mark DuMars' absence from the Penn State lineup tonight for an 80-72 victory.

Without their high-scoring playmaker, who was hospitalized with the grippe, the Lions couldn't get their offense rolling in the second half when Colgate was at its best.

Syracuse Coach Mark Guley, who sends his Orangemen against the Nittanians Saturday night in the Onondaga War Memorial, said DuMars' absence was the difference.

"He's a great basketball player. There aren't too many players who can take his place."

Even without DuMars, the Lions played well enough to leave the floor at intermission with the score tied, 33-33.

But things were different during the second half. John Mitchell had to leave the game temporarily with four minutes gone when he suffered a gash over his eyebrow.

By the time he got back, Colgate had moved ahead, 46-41.

The Red Raiders repeatedly forced the Lions into mistakes and converted many loose balls into fastbreak baskets.

Actually, it was Ken Norum who did most of the damage.

The 6-5 senior, held to one basket in the first half, came

through with 14 points in the second and continually broke Lion rallies with key tip-ins.

He had plenty of help from Bob Duffy and little John Doyle who worked the fastbreak to perfection tonight. Duffy was the game's leading scorer with 23 points and Doyle had 19.

The Lions fell behind by eleven, 60-49, but they fought back to within four, 72-68, with 2:50 left.

Mel Watkins, Duffy and Norum led a Colgate rally in the closing minutes which stopped the Raiders' bid and gave the Lions their 11th win against 12 losses. State now is 9-9 for the season.

State now is 9-9 for the season. Earl Hoffman was State's leading scorer with 20 points, his best performance to date. Mitchell, who was taken to the Colgate University Infirmary to have his eye examined, had 16 along with Gene Harris.

Rozsavolgyi Wins Mile; Moran Third

NEW YORK (AP) — Istvan Rozsavolgyi of Hungary hung back until one lap from home, then whipped to victory in the Baxter Mile in 4:04 last night in the New York Athletic Club Games before a packed house of 15,930 in Madison Square Garden.

The victory was Rozsavolgyi's fifth in five starts since arriving in the United States three weeks ago.

Pete Close of the Marine Corps was second, a good 12 yards back of Rosy. Ed Moran of the New York A.C. finished third, and Terry Sullivan of Rhodesia fourth.

Sullivan led for more than a half mile and was caught in :62.7 for the first quarter and 2:05.1 for the half. Then Moran took over and with two laps to go, yielded the lead to Close, who crossed the three-quarters in 3:05.8.

All the while Rosy was waiting and watching. When he decided to make his move with just a lap to go, he left Close in his wake and lengthened his margin with every stride.

His clocking set a meet record and was his best of all five indoor victories so far this season. Close was caught in 4:05.6.

Speidel May Switch Lineup For Duel With Orangemen

Charlie Speidel has made relatively few lineup changes through seven meets this season, but the wily mat mentor may make up for lost time at Syracuse today.

Down through the years Speidel has been famous for his shrewd last minute switches which have foiled the plans of opposing coaches. However, except for a few changes involving Neil Turner and co-captain Jerry Seckler at 147, State's lineup has been fairly consistent this year.

Speidel's tentative plans for Syracuse call for Denny Slattery (123), Tony Scordo (130), Dan Johnston (137) and Johnston Oberly (Hwt.) to start in their usual slots — but that's where the similarity ends.

Turner is scheduled for duty at 147. Seckler started there last week, but Speidel's tactics call for him to move to 157 with Ron Pifer going to 167. John Barone will move from 167 to 177 and Phil Myer will wrestle 191. Speidel may make still more changes before starting time.

Syracuse has lost four times in six outings. The Orange own wins over Ithaca, 20-6, and Franklin and Marshall, 22-8. They lost to Army, 22-10, Pitt, 28-3, Lehigh, 25-6, and Cornell, 15-12.

Oberly, undefeated in seven matches (two ties) will probably wrestle John Wynne. However, Orange Coach Joe Scandura may move Wynne down a notch to 191 and forfeit to the EIWA king.
