

Coeds Asked Not to Go Out Alone

Girls in the West Halls area were warned the other night about going out alone by the dean of women's staff after two coeds were grabbed by a man Monday night.

The girls escaped from the man and ran into McKee, Mrs. Grace Howe, senior resident in McKee said. According to Mrs. Howe, the incident occurred early in the evening, before 8 o'clock.

Col. William C. Pelten, head of the Department of Security, said that the patrol had been called out several times in the last two weeks to investigate similar incidents.

There are no known suspects, according to Pelten.

Mrs. Marian Davison, assistant to the Dean of Women, said that she had talked with the security department about the possibility of installing more lights in the space between McKee and Waring. Nothing has been decided on this question so far, Mrs. Davison said.

Selective Service Forms Available

Applications for the Selective Service College Qualification Test are now available at the dean of men's office, 109 Old Main. The test will be given April 27.

To be eligible to take the test, an applicant must be a selective service registrant who intends to request occupational deferment as a student. He must be satisfactorily pursuing a full-time undergraduate or graduate college course leading to a degree, and must not previously have taken the test.

PhysEd Will Offer Full Summer Plan

The College of Physical Education will be offering all required courses for men and women this summer for the first time.

The college will also provide three week counsellor training workshop and a health education course for kindergarten and elementary education majors.

The college is offering the required physical education courses so that a student can plan a complete schedule for the summer term, Allen R. Gray, associate professor of physical education, said.

The training workshop for camp counsellors scheduled from June 12 to 30 will be held at the Stone Valley camping area where participants will be living, Gray added. Since this training will be intensified for the three week period it will be classified as a three credit course.

In conjunction with the College of Education, a two credit physical education course designed to acquaint kindergarten and elementary education majors with ways of teaching physical education classes will also be offered, Gray said.

No activity courses, such as baseball and hockey, have been planned for physical education

majors since "we don't think there will be enough majors attending the summer term to merit offering them," Gray added.

However, the physical education student council is going to conduct a survey to see how many majors are planning to attend the summer term, and if enough students will be here, some activity courses will be offered, Gray said.

As in past summers the college will offer a wide variety of graduate courses and several non-activity courses for undergraduates. A three week health education workshop for elementary teachers will also be offered. This three credit course will run from June 12 through 30.
