Leis Sees No Value In Policy Statement

SGA may be able to issue a statement of policy concerning discriminatory clauses in campus organization charters, but the statement itself wouldn't be effective in eliminating the clauses, according to Lillian Leis, U.-Soph.

"Since Assembly members are elected by so few voters, SGA policies actually reflect personal feelings," Miss Leis said. "Because of this, a ruling on discrimination clauses would not reflect the feelings of the entire student body."

Miss Leis' comments were based on the issue now prevalent at other schools which have tried to set a definite policy in granting organizations charters if they draw up constitutions containing discriminatory clauses.

Speaking of private groups such as fraternities and sororities, Miss Leis said she did not think the administration on any campus should be able to designate who can become a member of the group.

Commenting on another campus issue, that of having a University bookstore, Miss Leis said she was in favor of having one — whether it was set up as an institutional or cooperative effort.

If a University bookstore is established, a professional manager would be worthwhile employing to run it, Miss Leis said.

"Time would decide whether we could afford to have one," Miss Leis said, "but it would definitely be a help in taking some of the responsibility from a single student."

On the traffic problem, Miss Leis said she was disappointed that no action was taken by Albert E. Diem, vice president in charge of business administration, about the parking problem on campus.

"I think we (Assembly) suggested sufficient changes to merit a trial period for the plan," she said.

On still another issue, that of reorganization of SGA and what type of structure a student government should have, Miss Leis made these comments.

"Reorganization of SGA could eliminate the overlapping created by so many different bodies doing the same things.

"If a reorganized SGA can compensate for the lack in student interest and a lack in representation of the entire student body, it would be assured of being effective on all campus issues."
