

Nittany 22 Wins League Title

Nittany 22 and the Celtics won IM independent basketball league titles last night while Westmoreland and Dauphin moved into the final round of their loop playoffs.

Nittany 22 smothered Nittany 38, 32-10; the Celtics dumped the Pick-ups, 29-18; Westmoreland topped Berks, 31-24; and Dauphin beat Cambria, 27-23.

Westmoreland and Dauphin will battle at 9:30 tonight for the league crown.

Al Driver collected 16 markers for Nittany 22 while Sal Rumore

had 4 of his team's 10 points. Bob Mugs paced the Celtic attack with nine markers. Skip Heckingdon and Paul Faris had five points apiece for the Pick-ups.

Dave Bolbach connected on four field goals and went 8-for-8 at the foul line for a total of 16 points to lead Westmoreland over Berks. Roy Brubaker had 10 for the losers.

Mike Formicone's 12 tallies were high for Dauphin. Ron Hill and Tom Mettrick both had six points for Cambria.
