

Garner to Appear At Rec Hall Sunday

Erroll Garner, one of the most celebrated of modern jazz pianists, will appear at 8 p.m. Sunday in Recreation Hall.

The performance is sponsored by the University Artist Series and ticket distribution will begin at 1:30 p.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk.

Garner, besides receiving the highest praise in this country, has been widely acclaimed throughout the world.

One Belgian newspaper critic, Carlos de Radzitsky, summarized his feeling for the man in the following way:

"A few chords of introduction . . . which give no hint of what will follow . . . then, suddenly, like a tight-rope walker coming down on the stiff rope after a successful somersault, the theme reveals itself, unexpected, but drawn by the hand of a master."

"This sturdy little man, with the profile of an Arab sheik, of calm and peaceful regard, gives the impression of risking his life each time he plays the piano," he said.

Erroll Garner was born in Pittsburgh in 1921 and has played the piano since he was three years old. He rebelled against all piano instruction and has never learned to read a note of music.

"Now, it's too late to learn, and one wonders what purpose it would serve," Radzitsky observed.

"Garner works the keyboard with full strokes, hardly looking at it, and draws from his instrument more melodic and rhythmic riches than all his colleagues put together," he said.

Garner will appear at the University as the first jazz artist to be presented by Impresario S. Hurok, sponsor of such artists as Isaac Stern, Marian Anderson, Artur Rubinstein and the Bolshoi Ballet.

Pattee Buys 17th Century Lit Books

Nearly 250 books of English literature published in the 17th and 18th Centuries have been purchased by the Pattee Library, Ralph J. McComb, librarian, said recently.

The books were selected by Dr. F. W. Bateson, professor of English at Oxford, and sent to the library.

The books, costing several thousand dollars, include first editions of "Gulliver's Travels" by Jonathan Swift (1726), "Sentimental Journey," by Laurence Sterne (1768) and works by Ben Jonson and Robert Burton which were printed in the early 1600's, McComb said.

Bateson, who was a visiting professor of English at the University last semester, is one of England's outstanding bibliographers.

Bateson agreed last semester to purchase works of 17th and 18th century English literature upon his return to England after noticing gaps in the library's collection, McComb said.

Just before his return home, two Oxford Elizabethan scholars sold a collection of books to Blackwell's, an English book dealing firm. This agency offered Bateson first choice of the scholars' books, McComb said.

The purchases are significant because they will greatly strengthen this area of research at the University, according to McComb. The books are expected to arrive within a few weeks.
