

Work Grants May Be Given

Outstanding juniors and seniors may be able to get work scholarships for the summer term under a new program announced by President Walker Monday.

The grants, to be known as "faculty aide scholarships," will be designated not only to provide funds to students, but also to give them the opportunity to gain experience by working with faculty members in their specialized fields, according to Wilmer E. Kenworthy, executive assistant to the president.

Students selected for the program will aid faculty members working on projects in certain areas of teaching or research, Kenworthy said.

The amount of the scholarship will vary with the length of the period covered by each project, but will not exceed \$100. One hundred scholarships will be awarded for the summer term.

According to Kenworthy, it has not been decided whether or not

the new program will be continued in other terms.

Any student wishing to be considered for the program should apply to his department head, Jean B. Vandell, secretary of scholarships explained.

Department heads will match students and faculty members who are to participate in the program, she said.

Whether or not a student will be able to be selected if no professor in his department wants to participate will not be determined until the applications are in, she added.
