

Counseling Forms Available at HUB

Applications for students interested in special orientation counseling are now available at the Hetzel Union desk, according to Thomas E. Brown, chairman of the SGA Special Orientation Committee.

All upperclass men and women are eligible for counseling, Brown said. Applicants will be interviewed by Delphi, sophomore men's hat society, and Brown. Forms must be returned to the HUB desk by 2 p.m. next Thursday.

"The counselors will work on a person to person basis with foreign students as a year-round project," Brown said.

Those chosen will be responsible for welcoming undergraduate international students on campus and explaining American social customs to them besides the

usual counseling duties, Brown said.

Counselors will also be asked to go through registration with foreign students, he said, and be available to answer questions the students may have throughout the year.

Brown said about 231 foreign undergraduates are expected to be admitted to the University next fall. One student will be assigned to each counselor.

In the past, he said, other groups and hat societies have undertaken a foreign student orientation, but their programs have been inconsistent from year to year.

"These counselors will have an extremely responsible position," Brown said, "since this is the first program that has been worked out in detail to aid foreign students."

Working with Brown's committee will be the University Christian Association and the Sophomore Class Advisory Board.

This appropriation ranges from 13 cents to \$1.75 per student. Fuller outlined two major difficulties inherent in this system: no provisions have been made

to allocate funds for new organizations, and there are no provisions to change the appropriations to individual groups as their purposes and functions change.

Fuller said the Budget Com-

mittee will try to determine whether redistribution of funds is necessary and in what areas. In any case, it will probably recommend that funds be allotted yearly according to budgets submitted by the organizations, he added.
