

# Phi Gam Captures IM Basketball Title

Phi Gamma Delta and the Untouchables are the 1961 IM basketball champions following impressive wins in the finals last night in Rec Hall.

The Untouchables ripped Nittany 22, 57-38; while Phi Gam had a harder time downing Delta Upsilon, 49-37.

Intramural Director Dutch Sykes said a playoff game between the two champions is being planned some time next week.

The win for the Untouchables was their 35th straight and marked their third consecutive independent championship.

Footballer Dick Hoak led the Untouchables with 16 points. Last year Hoak scored 27 points in the championship playoff.

Phi Gam built up a comfortable 10 point third quarter margin and then coasted to the championship.

## Pittsburgh Grabs DuMars in Draft

PITTSBURGH, Pa., March 20—Penn State's Mark DuMars was drafted yesterday by the Pittsburgh team in the new American Basketball League.

Lenny Litman, the general manager and owner of the Pittsburgh entry, picked 26 players—many from the tri-state area.

Litman, also took Duquesne's Bob Slobodnik and Ned Twyman; John Fridley and Dick Falenski of Pitt; and Lee Patrone of West Virginia.

Pittsburgh's top three draft choices were Tom Stith, an All-American from St. Bonaventure; Tony Jackson from St. Johns and Jack Egan from St. Josephs.

Litman says he expects a price war with the NBA for the services of Stith, Jackson and Egan.

DuMars wound up his Penn State career with 1139 points. The 5-10 playmaker was the second leading scorer in Lion history and captained the 1960-61 squad which finished with an 11-13 record.

## Moran Finishes Third in Cleveland K of C Mile

The 18-year-old Loyola University miler came from 10 yards back to edge Purdue's George Harvey and Penn State grad student Ed Moran in the Cleveland Knights of Columbus mile. His winning time was 4:08.

## Wilson Moves to Semifinals In IM Wrestling Tournament

Don Wilson of Sigma Phi Epsilon pinned footballer Bob Mitinger of Sigma Alpha Epsilon in a heavyweight battle last night to advance to the semi-finals in the IM wrestling tourney.

Wilson's fall over Mitinger came at 25 seconds of the third period. Mitinger led, 4-3, after the first period but Wilson, last year's 176-pound champion, pulled to an 8-4 lead before the pin.

In other action Beta Theta Pi's 176-pounder Dave Grubbs scored a fall over John Schultz of DU in 25 seconds. Grubbs also advanced to the semi-finals.

Bob Dean of Alpha Sigma Phi, last year's Independent champ at
