

Proctor to Speak On 'Abundant Life'

Dr. Samuel D. Proctor, executive director of the UCA, president of the Agricultural and Technical College of North Carolina, will speak on "What Is an Abundant Life?" at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

Proctor has served as pastor of the Baptist Church in Rhode Island, and as philosophy professor and president of Virginia Union University. In 1960 he was a member of the National Committee of the White House Conference for Children and Youth. He is now a member of the General Board of the National Council of Churches.

Proctor will also speak on "The Negro College and Direct Social Action" at 8 tonight in the Eisenhower Chapel Lounge for the University Christian Association forum.

The Reverend Samuel Gibson,

will be speaker for the Protestant worship service at 9 a.m. tomorrow in the Eisenhower Chapel. His topic will be "Jesus Christ Is Lord."
