

# ICCB, Placement To Hold Exposition

After College, what? A career exposition, to be held Tuesday and Wednesday, sponsored by the University Placement Service and the Intercollege Council Board, will attempt to answer this question.

Twenty-five companies from various parts of the country are sending representatives here to answer student questions concerning the type of work and training for particular jobs.

Each company will have a booth located on the ground floor of the Hetzel Union Building from 9 a.m. to noon Tuesday and Wednesday and from 1:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Wednesday.

"This will not be a place to find a job, but a place to receive information and aid in making career decisions," said Marjorie Downer, publicity chairman for the exposition.

## Dennis to Air Corps Plans On TV Show

Pennsylvanians will get a close-up evaluation of the Peace Corps program in a telecast from the University Sunday.

Guest on the question-and-answer panel will be Lawrence E. Dennis, who was granted a leave from his position as vice president for academic affairs to join the international organization in an executive capacity.

The telecast will be broadcast over the facilities of WFBG-TV, Channel 10, Altoona, at 6 p.m.

Dennis, who began his duties in Washington a month ago, is directly responsible for the recruitment, selection and training of candidates for the Peace Corps.

Questions will be directed to him by undergraduate and graduate students, including two from foreign countries and a man-and-wife combination.

# Robinson to Talk on Africa

"Operation Crossroads Africa," a student study-workcamp project held in West Africa last summer, will be the topic of a talk by James H. Robinson, founder and director of the project, at 7:30 p.m. tonight in 121 Sparks.

Robinson is a frequent visitor to Africa and pastor of the Church of the Master in New York City. A reception will be held in the Memorial Lounge of the Eisenhower Chapel by the Cosmopolitan Club, following the program.

In many ways, "Operation Crossroads Africa" was a forerunner of the Peace Corps. One hundred students from 75 col-

lege campuses lived and worked for two months with tribal groups in rural areas building schoolhouses, hospitals, community centers and digging drainage ditches. The students met with political and governmental leaders, businessmen and village chiefs. "Operation Crossroads Africa" will be returning to West Africa this summer, and will provide students with an experience similar to the future Peace Corps.

Robinson intends to concentrate on the continent of Africa for the next five years, taking another group to West Africa in 1961 and two pilot projects to East Africa. His schedule includes enlarging the groups in East Africa, getting into Central Africa and eventually into South Africa.
