The Reverend Harry B. Adams, associate professor of practical theology at Yale Divinity School, will speak at the University Chapel Service at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab.

Richardson Dilworth, mayor of Philadelphia, will not speak as scheduled because of illness. Adams, a Yale graduate, is the author of "The Bible Message."

Critics Acclaim Canadian Ballet For Standards

The National Ballet of Canada, which will appear at 8 tomorrow evening in Recreation Hall, has been acclaimed by critics in three countries for its "excellent dance standard" and "audience excitement."

Lois Smith, prima ballerina, will lead the company in female songs. She has been noted for her performances in "Swan Lake" and "Coppelia" as well as in the tragic "Giselle" which is being reviewed this year in her honor.

This season Miss Smith is starting with David Adams, the company's premier danseur, in the full-length presentation of "Princess Aurora" which is based on highlights from "Sleeping Beauty."

David Adams has been called one of the world's leading dancers—a title earned by dancing in Europe before joining the National Company.

Adams, a six-footer, is known for his leaps and physique among ballet-goers. He has previously danced lead roles with London's Metropolitan Ballet and with the Royal Ballet.


Art Professor to Lecture


Petroleum Refining Lab Given Research Grant
