

SGA to View Representation Concert Pianist Will Perform

SGA's committee of the whole decided through a straw vote last night to continue on two main ideas for Assembly representation.

One plan is to have representatives from the classes, living areas and the college councils. The other plan is to have representation from the living areas with the class presidents also sitting on Assembly.

The committee decided to concentrate discussion on the two ideas after the 18 Assembly members present voted against a proposal by Walt Darran, U.-Sr., to have an all-University Cabinet

which would act in an advisory capacity, similar to the present Cabinet's status and an Assembly which would be the sole legislative body, also in keeping with the present status of Assembly.

Although a total of seven plans incorporating the three original ideas were presented at the meeting, no individual plan was decided on. At the committee's meeting Sunday night, a straw vote was taken on a combined system of representation.

The committee, established when Assembly adjourned itself last Thursday night will meet again at 7 p.m. tonight.

Irene Schreier will present a piano concert at 8 p.m. today at Hillel Auditorium, 224 Locust Lane.

Miss Schreier made her first public appearance in the United States at the age of 11, in San Francisco.

Since that early performance she has appeared on the concert stage throughout the country and in Europe.

The program, to be given as a memorial to the late Dr. Lowenfeld, will feature the music of Schubert and Beethoven.
