

# Soph Board Studies Summer Activities

The Sophomore Class Advisory Board, under the chairmanship of Edwin Grinberg, has surveyed over 60% of the various organizations on campus to determine to what extent they are planning to operate during the summer term.

The survey shows that some will operate under small changes, some will operate on the same basis as they do in the other terms and some will not function at all.

Board members found the following activities scheduled for the summer:

The Business Administration student council will hold monthly meetings and will draw up an orientation program for their students.

The Daily Collegian will publish at least one issue a week. WDFM will be on the air, probably from 7 p.m. until midnight seven days a week.

The Student Check Cashing Agency will operate on a half-day basis.

The Hillel Foundation plans to continue with religious services only on Friday nights and Saturday mornings. The Lutheran Student Association will operate on a limited schedule.

Organizations planning to operate as usual, according to the survey, are: University Amateur Radio Station, Camera Club, Schupplatters Club, Student Tribunals, Traffic Court, Phi Delta Kappa, and Sigma Tau Delta.

Those definitely not going to function are: Liberal Arts Student Council, Engineering Student Council, Agriculture Student Council, Home Economics Student Council, Mineral Industries Student Council, Interfraternity Council and Panhellenic Council.

Thespians, Players, Froth, News and Views, Central Promotion Agency, Newman Club, Leonides, Jazz Club, Orchestra, Alpha Phi Omega, Gamma Sigma Delta, Accounting Club, Pr.-Veterinary Societies, Poultry Club, Future Farmers of America, 4-H Club, Agriculture Engineering Club, Clover Club and Horticulture Club.

Activities with indefinite plans are: Education Student Council, Association of Women Students, Women's Recreation Association, Pi Gamma Alpha, and the International Club.

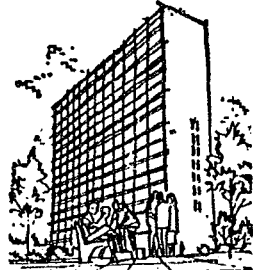
