

Bookstore Survey Nears Completion

Phil Steinhauer, chairman of the SGA Bookstore Committee, said yesterday that 775 questionnaires on the establishment of a University bookstore have been received.

Steinhauer said that his final report to the Board of Trustees, who requested that a need for a University bookstore be proven, will be made before the end of the semester if possible.

Steinhauer said that 800 questionnaires are needed to tabulate the final results of the poll, which was originally started about three weeks ago with 1,000 forms.

The number of forms needed for a 90 per cent return is 790, Steinhauer said.

To allow for error in final calculating, the committee needs more than the desired number, he said.

The results of the survey will not be announced until interpreted.

tation of the tabulation is made, Steinhauer said. Working with the committee is Leslie P. Greenhill, associate director of academic research and services.

Steinhauer said he will meet with Greenhill Wednesday to examine the figures which have been calculated and will then meet with his committee to explain them.

The original sample of 1,000 forms was decreased to 900 because the committee found that some were sent to people who were student teaching, or who had dropped out of school. Mistakes in the student directory accounted for the rest of the decrease, Steinhauer said.

He attributed all the errors to the fact that the survey was made by random selection of names to insure a valid result. An average of 1 out of 15 students was contacted, Steinhauer reported.
