

# Revised Constitution Planned for May 11

A completed revision of the SGA Constitution will be presented to Assembly on May 11, by the Executive Reorganization Committee, Richar Haber, SGA president, announced yesterday.

## Williams Calls For New Stand On Budget

The time has come to take action to increase the state appropriation for Penn State, Gomer Williams, former member of the SGA Back the Budget Committee, said last night.

A bill appropriating \$125 million for the University is due to arrive on the floor of the State House of Representatives any day, Williams said.

This bill was sponsored by J. Dean Pollen, chairman of the House Appropriations Committee, and is a 13-month adjustment of the amount recommended by the governor in his budget message in January.

"The only hope for an amendment of this bill is through the action that could be taken by Governor David L. Lawrence or Representative William F. Green, Jr.," Williams said.

Green, D-Philadelphia, is a United States congressman regarded by many as the most powerful man in Pennsylvania politics today.

"Only a firm stand by the Governor will enable Penn State to receive the full appropriation," he said, adding, "Both students and parents should write now."

Williams asked that letters written to the Governor ask for an amendment to increase the appropriation to \$23.1 million, the amount requested by the University for 1961-62.

The addresses for the Governor and Representative Green are: The Honorable David L. Lawrence, Governor, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Harrisburg, Penna., Honorable William F. Green, Jr., The House Office Building, Washington 25, D.C.

## C.D. to Hold Drill

A Statewide Civil Defense Drill will take place tomorrow between 3 and 4:10 p.m., according to William C. Pelton, director of security at the University.

The steam whistle at the Power Plant will sound one long signal as an alert at 3 p.m.; one long and one short signal to signify take cover at 4 p.m.; and one long signal alarm for the all clear at 4:10 p.m.

Students walking on campus will not be expected to observe the drill. Students not on campus, however, are expected to take cover when the alarm sounds.

## Harris, Hays to Discuss Increase in Appropriation

Dale Harris, Back the Budget Committee member, will present the committee's arguments on the need for an increased University appropriation to State Senator Jo Hays, D-Centre, at his home this morning.

The meeting, which was arranged by Lee E. Corter, assistant professor of political science, could lead to personal presentation of petitions for an increased appropriation to Governor David L. Lawrence, Miss Harris said.

## Sunshine, Mild Weather To Bring Pleasant High

The combination of partly cloudy skies, abundant sunshine, and mild temperatures should provide rather pleasant weather today.

The Executive Committee heard reports last night from sub-committees which have completed a study of the legislative, executive and by-laws sections of the constitutional revisions proposed by Duane Alexander in March.

Haber asked the sub-committees to draw up finished texts of their respective sections of the constitution and present them to the Executive Committee May 9.

This will give interested persons a chance to hear the revised constitution and to interject any further ideas before the final draft is presented to Assembly on Thursday, Haber said.

He also asked the sub-committees to draw up a list of proposals pertaining to each section of possible powers and areas of legislation for the future.

According to Haber this list will serve as a "constitutional crystal ball" for the Senate Committee on Student Affairs when it reviews the revised constitution for final approval.

Each sub-committee was also asked to submit a list of interpretations clarifying any vague statements or terms in the constitution.
