

Liberals Postpone Election of Chairman

A vigorous pre-meeting telephone campaign for control of Liberal party ended up in a draw Tuesday night, when the election of a party chairman was postponed indefinitely.

For half an hour before Tuesday's steering committee meeting, Dale Harris, acting party chairman, and Theodore Simon, leader of a rebel group within the party, held a telephone campaign in an attempt to get enough votes to control the party.

After the meeting started and both Miss Harris and Simon were nominated to lead the party, a bitter discussion led to the reopening of nominations and to postponement of elections.

Charges and counter-charges echoed back and forth at the meeting.

Simon compared the present position of Liberal party to that of a corporation that has gone bankrupt. A bankrupt firm is put in a receivership to get it back on its feet, Simon said.

Liberal party is "bankrupt," he exclaimed, adding "it needs new leadership to give it renewed vigor."

Miss Harris, in answering Si-

mon's charges, said that she couldn't see where the party has fallen apart under her leadership.

She said that she didn't get the cooperation she needed to run the party. Often steering committee members didn't even go to party meetings, she said.

The party will meet Sunday to discuss its future and perhaps to continue with the nominations of a party chairman, Miss Harris said last night.

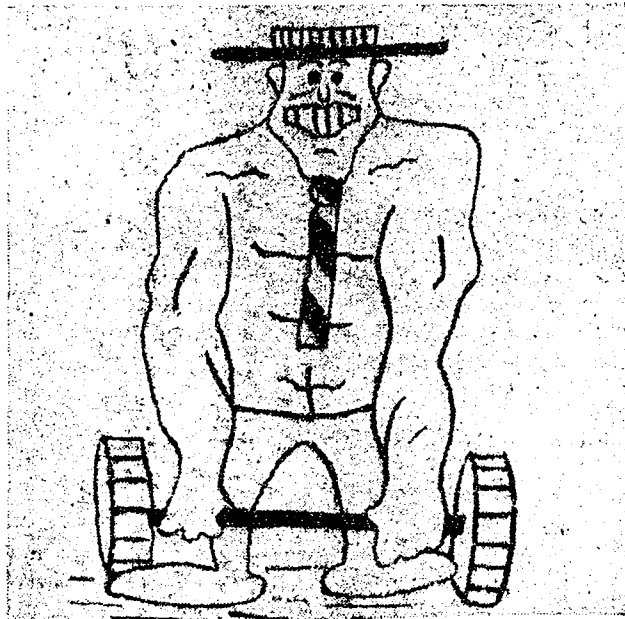

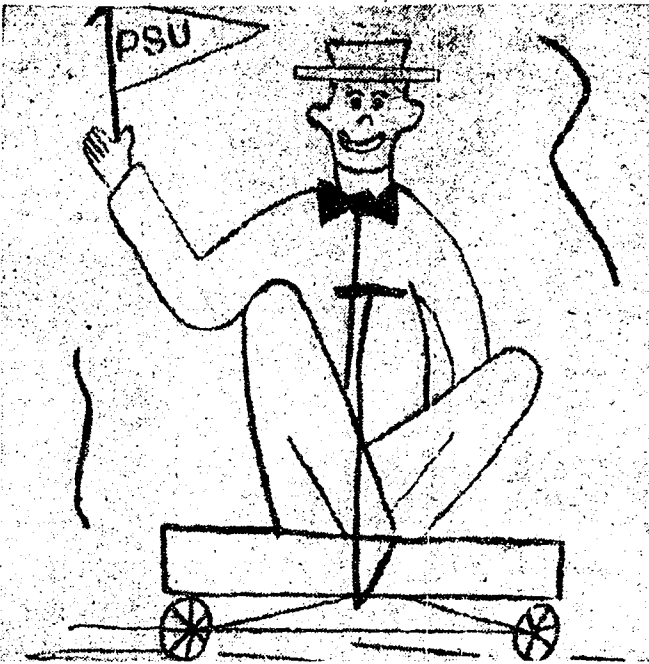

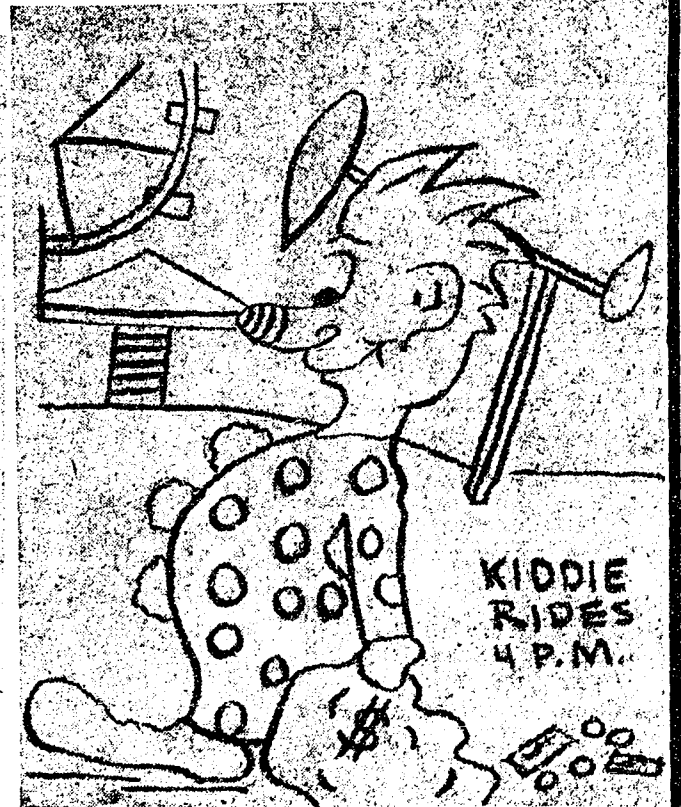
