## Lions Bomb Scarlet, 15-2; Kikla Notches 3rd Win

Joe Bedenk's baseballers pounded out 16 hits, including a pair of home runs, behind the 6-hit pitching of southpaw Ed Kikla to beat Rutgers, 15-2, on Beaver Field yesterday.

Kikla struck out ten and walked three while going the route for his third win without a loss.

The classy lefthander was in trouble only twice—when the Scarlet scored their runs in the second and ninth innings.

Rutgers (7-3-1) opened the scoring in the top of the second with an unearned run.

The Lions knotted the score in their half of the inning and then blew the game wide open with a big 5-run third.

Bart Brodtkin led off the frame with a walk, moved to second on an infield out and scored on Dick Pae's single.

Zeke DeLong forced Pae for the second out, but four consecutive hits by Don Jonas, John Phillips, Al Gursky and Barry Rodenhaver gave the Nittanies a 6-1 lead and sent starter and loser Bob Pietrucha to the showers.

## Cepeda Blasts 2-Run Homer In SF's 8-4 Win Over Cubs

CHICAGO (AP) — A shaky Chicago defense, leaking three unearned runs, and Orlando Cepeda's two-run homer boosted the San Francisco Giants to an 8-4 victory over the Cubs yesterday.

Cepeda's bleacher shot in the sixth gave the Giants 15 homers in four consecutive games, one behind the major league record set by the Milwaukee Braves in 1953 and again in 1956. Tuesday, the Giants matched the three-game record of 14 homers.

Chicago's Ernie Banks slammed his Nos. 4 and 5 home runs of the season, but both were solo blasts which didn't help the luckless loser, Jack Curtis, who yielded only five hits before he was sent to cover in a three-run Giant seventh.

ST. PAUL-MINNEAPOLIS (AP) — The New York Yankees bombed the Minnesota Twins with seven runs in two big innings and swept the second of their three-game stand 7-3 yesterday.

For the second day in a row the Yanks teed off on an ace Twins pitcher, shelling Pedro Ramos in the seventh with a four-run, four-hit outburst. Camilo Pascual lost to the Yankees Tuesday.

New York got to Ramos for three unearned runs in the fourth on a combination of two hits, a walk, and two errors.

Mickey Mantle, leading the American League in home runs—8—and runs batted in—22, extended his hitting streak to 15 straight games.

## Liston, Machen Still Top 'Ring' Rating

NEW YORK (AP) — Sonny Liston and Eddie Machen remained the top two contenders for Floyd Patterson's heavyweight title in the current ratings announced by Ring Magazine.

Speculation has been rampant the past few weeks as to whom Patterson would meet in his next defense, possibly in late summer.

Liston is actively campaigning for a title fight while Henry Cooper, of England, ranked fourth, and Tom McNeeley, ninth-ranked from Arlington, Mass., also have been mentioned along with Machen.

Harold Johnson, who defended his National Boxing Association title last month against Von Clay, was ranked as top contender to Archie Moore for the light heavyweight crown.
