

2 SGA Committees Plan Final Revisions

The executive and legislative sub-committees of the SGA reorganization committee held a joint meeting last night to make final revisions on the sections of the proposed constitution with which the groups are dealing.

The legislative committee agreed to recommend to the reorganization committee that all legislation be required to go through rules committee before it be introduced on the floor. According to this recommendation, a unanimous vote of the assembly would be required to bring legislation that has not gone through rules committee to the floor.

The committee also agreed to recommend that people in the gallery not be recognized to speak during a student government meeting. If a student wants to have views expressed, he will have to have them introduced through his Assemblymen. The committee said that it feels that since the Assemblymen will have definite constituencies this procedure should be followed.

The executive committee is scheduled to recommend that the student government cabinet be made up of 17 members

—the 10 college council presidents, a representative from each of the following areas: MRC, IFC, AWS, TIM and the president, vice president and secretary-treasurer of student government.

The committee discussed the function of the student government cabinet and agreed that the cabinet should be an advisory group. The committee agreed to ask the entire reorganization committee's opinion on the function of cabinet and on whether the student government president should have the authority to appoint additional members to cabinet.

The succession of student government officers for president will be recommended as follows: president, vice president, president pro-tempore.

Players Cancel 'Three Sisters'

The Penn State Players' production of "The Three Sisters" has been cancelled for today and tomorrow.

Warren Smith, director, said the play was cancelled due to a death in the immediate family of David Rahe, one of the actors.

"There was no one available to train for Rahe's part in time," Smith said.

The play, written by Anton Chekhov, will run every weekend until May 20. The run could not be extended because of the final exam schedule which begins May 27, Smith explained.

Tickets may be exchanged for another performance or money will be refunded at the Hetzel Union desk, he said.

Rose Gets Support Of Heart Institute

The Heart Institute of the National Institutes of Health has renewed its support of gas chromatography research of Dr. Arthur Rose, professor of chemical engineering, for an additional year. A second grant of \$31,000 has been made to supplement a grant given last year.

Dr. Rose's research applies the principles of chemical engineering to separate and purify the various kinds of fatty acids and fats that occur in natural tissue.

The National Science Foundation has awarded Cooperative Graduate Fellowships to ten graduate students and three seniors for the 1961-62 academic year.

Each of the recipients will receive stipends of \$2,200 per year and have their tuition paid by the foundation.


