The program is divided into two plans, an elective study for those who wish to spend one term as foreign university, and a specialized study for those who want to take a leave of absence from the University to study. abroad. De Levie announced that over 200 of the applicants requested the elective study program.
The applications that we already received are being proc essed by the Liberal Arts com mittee on stucy abroad, de Levie said.
