Association Grants 15 Scholarships

Fifteen outstanding freshmen among the thousands of students admitted to the University each year hold Alumni Memorial Scholarships.

The Penn State Alumni Fund established the Alumni Memorial Scholarship program in 1955 because it was be-

Alumni scholars receive awards

Funds for the scholarships were made available through gifts to the University which were specifically designated for Alumni Fund scholarships.

A recipient must maintain a 3.0 ships awarded on the basis of academic achievement.
