

# LA Committee Reports Library Lacks Material

Many of the reference books which were said to be basic needs for the Pattee Library last year have not yet been acquired, according to a report by the Committee on Library and Research of the College of Liberal Arts faculty.

"Though it is gratifying to see progress in the ordering of reference materials, the committee . . . urges that increased attention be given by the library staff to this vital area of library holdings," the report read.

The ordering process for books and materials was another of last year's shortcomings which the committee reported has not been fully remedied.

The report asks for an increase in staff funds so that additional personnel may be hired in the purchasing department.

It also requests that book orders be made uniformly throughout the year, and not just in the rush period between Nov. 15 and April 1.

These requests were included in the committee's report last year, but because the problem still exists the group said, it was

repeated as one of this year's suggestions.

A recommendation that the library hours be extended for faculty and qualified persons was again mentioned in this year's report.

A suggestion that a system of written permits be developed for this purpose was supported in the committee's report.

ocratic processes for South Korea. Although the junta promised to turn the government over to what it called conscientious politicians, none of its statements mentioned whether elections are to be held.

American authorities here were said to still feel that the proper position had been taken in standing behind a legally elected government against a military seizure of power.
