

State Head Resigns In South Korea

SEOUL, South Korea (AP) — President Yun Po-sun gave his blessing to South Korea's new military rulers and announced his resignation in a humbly worded statement yesterday.

Military chiefs pushed a crackdown that included the arrest of almost 3,500 persons. Official announcements said prisoners included 2,500 hoodlums and 930 leftists considered potential Communist suspects. A security decree sets up severe penalties for membership in what it broadly termed antistate organizations.

By accident or design, Yun's announced resignation clouded diplomatic relations between South Korea and its friends abroad including the United States.

Both American and British officials had said their recognition of the military takeover would be automatic because Yun remained chief of state.

Now Korea's allies may face the legal puzzle of whether to recognize Lt. Gen. Chang Do-Young, 38, chief of the junta that calls itself "the Supreme Council for National Reconstruction." U.S. spokesmen here opposed the coup.

Yun's decision to step out came amid rumors — authoritatively denied — that small-scale fighting had broken out on the central sector of the truce line dividing the South from Communist North Korea.

Soviets to Aid Laotian Truce

GENEVA (AP) — The Soviet Union agreed yesterday to help in hurrying helicopters, planes and trucks to Laos for the control commission so it can enforce a truce. It was the first major action of the Geneva conference now four days old.

Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko, who has stalled the conference with demands for veto power over the commission's work, gave the go-ahead at the insistence of Canada.

Gromyko agreed with Foreign Secretary Howard C. Green of Canada that there was urgent

need to get transport and communications equipment to the Indian-Canadian-Polish commission in the jungle kingdom.

"I think we have won a great victory," Green told newsmen. U.S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk also was pleased.

The 14-nation conference sent off a message to the three-power commission asking it to list its requirements.


The action came as foreign ministers began to head for home, leaving the conference work to their deputies.

Gore's assertion drew quick opposition from other members of the Senate Foreign Relations subcommittee which heard Lemnitzer's account.
