Senate Group Acts On 12 Student Cases

The Senate Sub-Committee on Individual Discipline took action against 12 students Wednesday, according to a report issued from the Dean of Men's office yesterday.

Two juniors, two sophomores and one freshman were placed on disciplinary probation until the end of the fall term.

The students, all minors, were involved in a drinking session during which one of the students became ill in a residence hall, the report said.

A junior and a sophomore were placed on suspended suspension until the end of the fall term of 1962. The report said that the two students had been drinking and had stolen a tropical plant from the Warnock Dining Hall.

In addition, a freshman was placed on disciplinary probation until the spring term of 1962 for setting off firecrackers in his residence hall.

A sophomore was placed on disciplinary probation until the fall term for tampering with another student's mail box and delaying the mail from being delivered on time to the proper person.

The report also said that a freshman was placed on suspended suspension until the end of the fall term for "enticing" a coed to leave her residence hall at an early morning hour to discuss personal problems.

Two freshmen were placed on

disciplinary probation until the fall term for showing disrespect to University officials and for accumulating a number of violations in their residence halls.

'Back the Budget' Rally To Be Held Tomorrow

A "Back the Budget" pep rally sponsored by the three political parties will be held tomorrow afternoon on the steps of Old Main, Mike Dzvoniak, University party chairman, said last night.

The rally will begin with a motorcade, and a band will be present, Dzvoniak said. Several speakers are expected to discuss the present budget situation and what can be accomplished in the campaign, he said.

SGA President Dennis Foianini said that the event is expected to attract state-wide coverage. A poor showing by students at the rally would be extremely detrimental to the "Back the Budget" campaign, but a good showing would be very effective, he said.

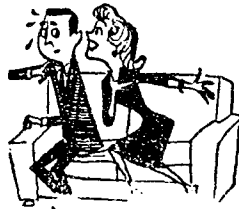
