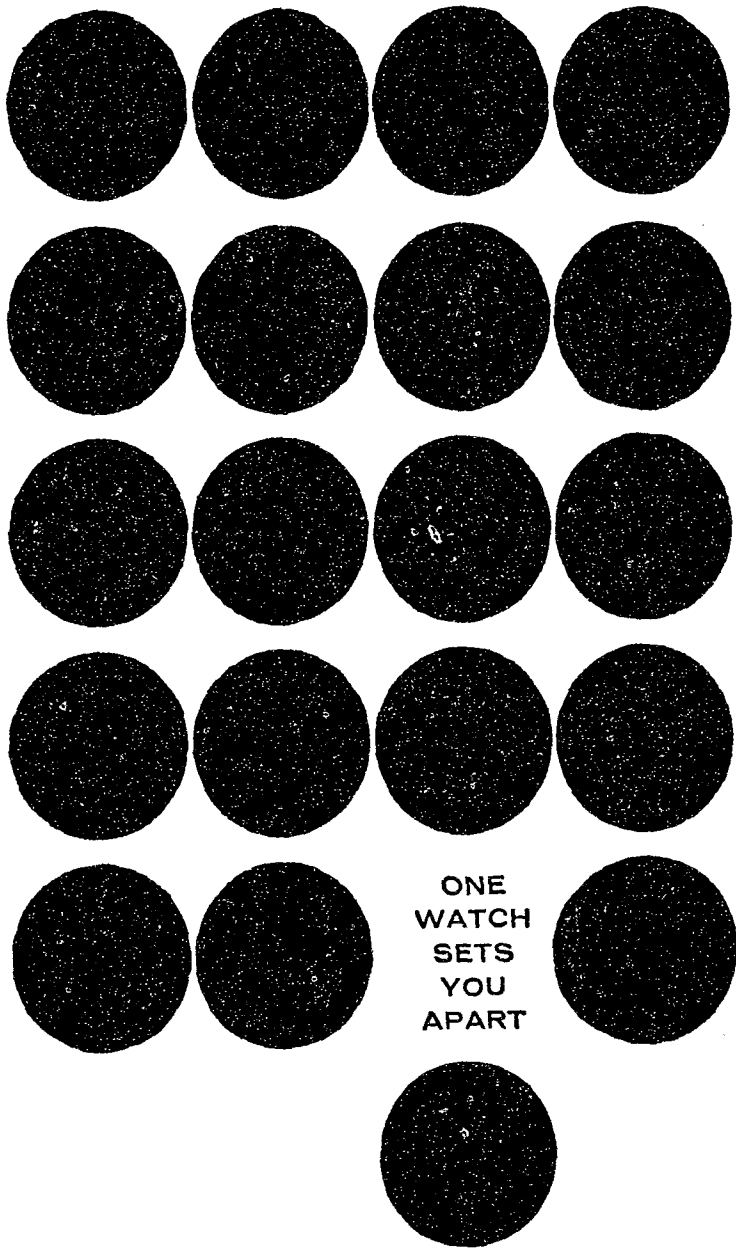

Later I shall present a plan on how Penn State could receive their appropriation.

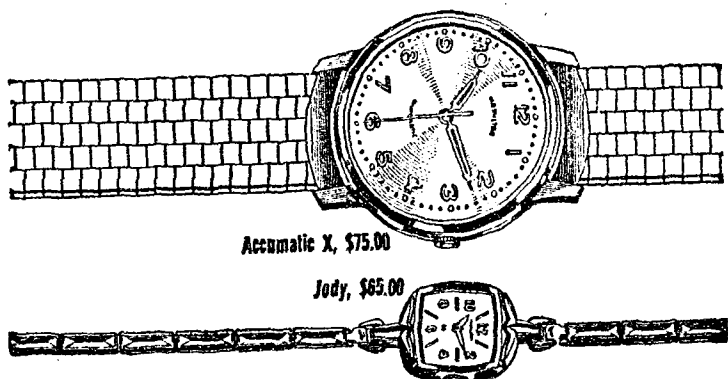

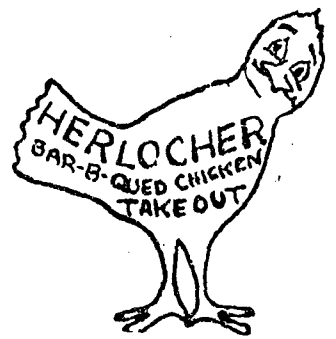
