

# Frank Will Give Concert In Schwab

In a return appearance Claude Frank, internationally known pianist, will give a concert for the first artist series program of the summer term at 8 p.m. Wednesday, June 21, in Schwab.

Tickets will be available to students at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday and to non-students at 9 a.m. Monday at the Hetzel Union desk. Distribution of tickets will continue until Wednesday.

Frank was one of the last pupils of Artur Schnabel and has been closely associated with Serkin's Marlboro Festival and School since 1953. Frank has appeared throughout Europe and North America with orchestras and chamber ensembles. He has given solo recitals on radio, television and in concert halls.

Frank was born in Germany, but has made his home in the United States since 1941.

The Washington, D.C. Evening Star commented on one of Frank's performances as a "phenomenal artist who combines the icy brilliance of Schnabel with the glowing passion of Serkin, and comes up with something that is uniquely his own."

The program to be presented here will include Schuman's Arabesque, Opus 18; Mozart's Sonata in F. Major, K332; Beethoven's Sonata in A Major, Opus 101; selections from Debussy; Liszt's Sonnetta 123; and the Hungarian Rhapsody, No. 11.

Classes at the Pennsylvania State University in 1859 started at 6 a.m., immediately after devotionals and breakfast.

# 11th Institute Scheduled For Alumni

The 11th annual Alumni Institute and class reunions will be held this weekend with 1500 to 2000 former graduates scheduled to return, Ross Lehman, assistant executive secretary of the Alumni Association, said.

Class banquets, lectures and informal parties have been arranged by the reunion classes in coordination with the Alumni Institute, he said.

Registration for all classes will open in the Hetzel Union lobby Thursday at 1:30 p.m. and will continue through Saturday.

The Alumni Institute, the more serious aspect of the weekend, is scheduled to begin at 10:30 a.m. Friday with a panel discussion led by members of the faculty on "The Exploding World."

The purpose of the institute is to "offer a program of lectures, panel discussions and meetings and to give the alumni a chance to meet present members of the faculty," Lehman explained.

He added that this is a combination of "provocative discussion with the remeeting of old friends."

Included in the program will be a special weekend exhibit of old photos and other memorabilia of the University and town. These will be displayed in the Assembly room of the Nittany Lion Inn.

Returning alumni will be housed in McElwain and Simmons residence halls. Members of classes which graduated fifty or more years ago (called "Pioneers") will be housed in the Nittany Lion Inn.

# Jacques Given Ed Scholarship

An Education Student Council scholarship of \$100 has been awarded to Charles Jacques, junior in secondary education from Natrona Heights.

The scholarship was awarded on the basis of service to the College of Education. In addition, the recipient must have a 2.5 all-University average.

Barbara Johnson announced that Education Student Council will hold an Open House on Oct. 7, in the fall term. The council plans to invite 500 high school and Future Teachers of America Club members from throughout the state.

Seventy-two students and 13 alumni will visit 10 European cities and perform in four music festivals this summer as members of the University and Meditation Chapel Choirs.

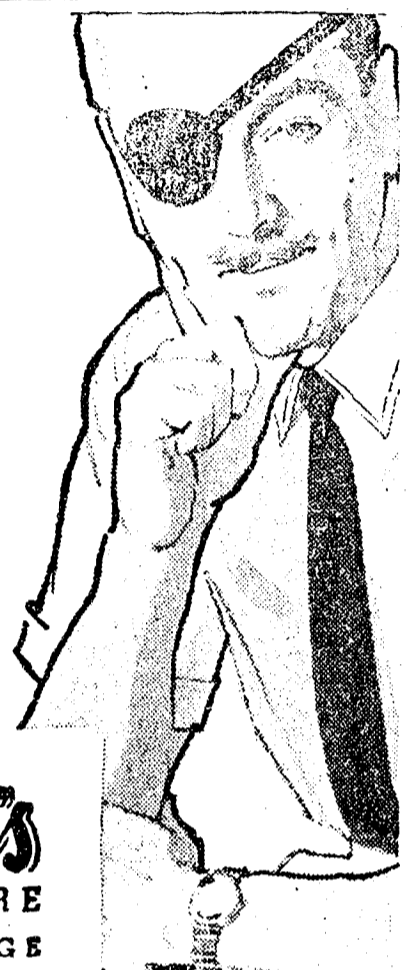
