

# 8 Lions Enter NCAA Finals

Bobby Brown and Steve Morehead will lead an eight-man Penn State contingent into the NCAA track and field championship Friday and Saturday at Franklin field in Philadelphia.

Morehead was the runner-up in the 3,000 meter steeplechase in last year's meet. But he will have his work cut out for him this year with such outstanding runners as Bobby Lowe of Brown and Abeline Christian's John Lawlor providing stiff competition.

Brown, the 1960 IC4A 100 and 220 champ will have to be at his

very best to keep up with the competition. This year's sprint field includes at least six men who have run the century in 9.5 or better. Brown's best time this year has been 9.4 which he ran in the Quantico Relays and also in a dual meet against the Quantico Marines.

Jim Schwab in the javelin, Dick Campbell and Jerry Wettstone in the high jump, Gerry Norman in the three-mile run, and Herm Weber and Mike Miller in either the mile or half-mile round out the Lion entries.

USC is a strang favorite to de-

throne Kansas as the team champion in this year's meet. The Trojans' well-balanced team is led by Olympian Dallas Long who set a new Collegiate record of 64' 11 1/2" in the shotput last week.

Oregon, with the top distance men in the country, is given the biggest chance to upset USC. Dyrrole Burleson will lead the Oregon team into the battle. Burleson set a new American record in the mile when he traveled the 1780 yards in 3:37.8 last month.

San Jose State, Houston and Villanova are rated as long-shots for the team title.

The 100 and 220 will provide the most interest and best dual of the meet. Dennis Johnson of San Jose will head a star-studded field. Johnson has equaled the world 100 record of 9.3 three times this year. Frank

Budd of Villanova has also equaled the mark, and Harry Jerome of Oregon and his teammate Roscoe Cook have run 9.4's.

Budd has turned in the best time in the furlong, a sparkling 20.2 around one turn.

Rex Crawley of USC is favored in the 440, having run a 46.2 this year, but Earl Young, a member of the 1960 Olympic team, will give him a good battle along with Dick Edmunds of Princeton, this year's IC4A champ.

Burleson will be shooting for a double in the 880 and the mile. Whether he has the stamina to do it remains to be seen.

Al Lawrence of Houston is in a class by himself in the three-mile run.

John Thomas, who has finally hit his stride again, appears

to be a sure winner in the high jump, but Southern Cal's Bob Avant, who has cleared seven feet will give him a battle.

The pole vault will prove very interesting with George Davis and his fiberglass pole heading the field. Davis has the pending world record of 15' 10 1/4" which he set in the Big Eight meet last month. But since then, Davis has not been able to do any better than 15 feet.

The last time Penn State had an NCAA champ was in 1949 when Horace Ashenfelter won the two-mile run with a 3:03.9 clocking.

If the weather is right the world's record of 9.3 in the century, which has withstood an onslaught of great sprinters, may fall. Jesse Owens first set it in 1936.

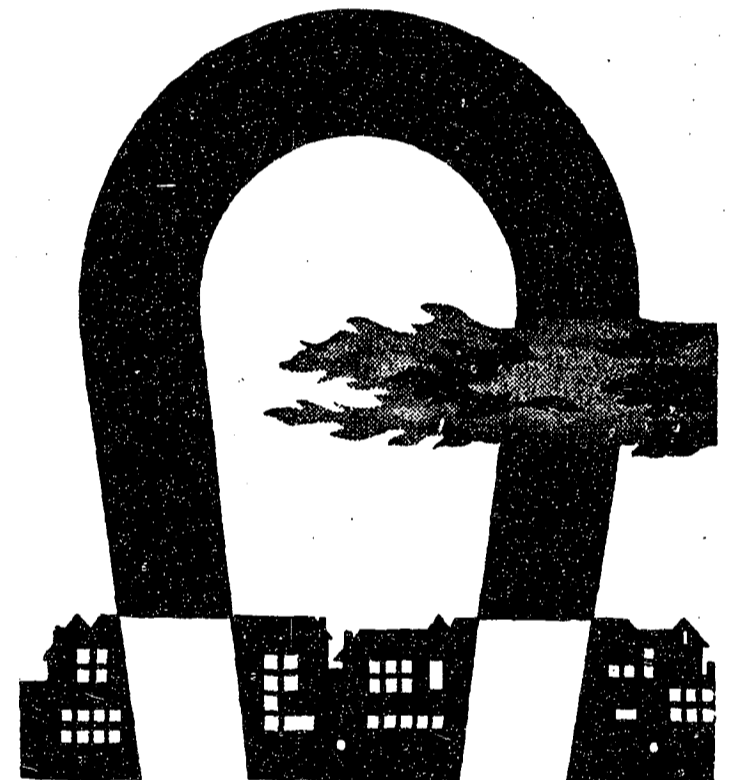

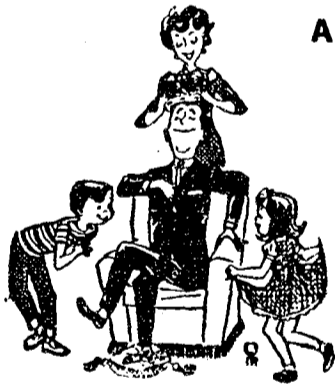
