

# 9 Art Purchase Prizes Given

Eight University Purchase Prizes were awarded at the annual summer students' exhibition which opened Monday at the gallery of the Hetzel Union Building. The show will run until Aug. 4.

Purchase prizes were awarded by a professional 5-man jury which included Hobson Pittman, instructor in painting and criticism at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts and the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and teacher of the summer painting class.

**IN COMMENTING** on the works exhibited Pittman said that this year the exhibition was "notably experimental."

He added that this year's exhibition contains the work of some well known young artists who have exhibited all over the country. He mentioned Frank Cason, Myrri Kreiger, Jean Osborn, James Stawarky, Eva White and Kenneth Wilson.

Purchase prizes, which mean that the paintings will be added to the University collection, were awarded to Lois Bower, for "Bedroom," Robert Boyer for "Gourds," Cason for "Mauve Bottle," Susan Crary for "Landscape With Two Figures," June Howard Crunick for "Red Geranium," Timothy Hews for "Chamber Music," Kenneth Kuhn for "Junction."

**THE CLASS PURCHASE** prize was awarded to Kenneth Wilson for "Small Pitcher."

Honorable mentions awarded by the professional jury went to Boyer for "Evening Landscape," Mrs. Osborn for "Park Still Life," Mrs. White for "Garden of Flowers," and Wilson for "Prosperina Treasure."

# Research Program Measures Creativity

Can an intangible like creativity in art, science or in any field be measured?

This is one of the questions which Dr. Kenneth Beittel, associate professor of art education, and two assistants are attempting to answer in a one-year research program.

The program, supported by a grant of \$18,900 from the National Science Foundation, uses visual arts as its basis, and is designed to determine how "various dimensions of creativity differ from each other," Beittel said.

**ONE OF THE GOALS** of the program is to discover better methods of finding or predicting creative talent in students, and to devise newer measures leading to educational experimentation for the development of creativity.

Professor Calvin Taylor of the University of Utah, a widely known expert in the field, will serve as consultant to the research project during the summer.

"The study of creativity," Beittel said, "while comparatively new, has at least a 10-year history."

**THUS FAR** the studies have been done on students from ninth grade to the college level. Beittel said that he and his assistants have been unable to go below the ninth grade level on the present tests.

Both non-art and art students have been studied, but the art students have been included primarily for definition and comparison, he said.

**THE STUDIES** have shown the general effects of art on students, Beittel said. "We have some feel-

ing that the arts are useful to general education in the measurement of creativity and to increase creativity," he said. "We want a new slant to the study of creativity," he added.

The study may have application in other fields, Beittel said. Some of the measures which have been developed have already been applied in the Westinghouse Engineering Education Center in Pittsburgh.

A pre-orientation program, designed for women who will be entering in the fall term and who are on campus for testing and counseling, is being conducted by the Association of Women Students summer council.

The coeds participating in the program are supplementing the regular counseling given by the Dean of Women's office, Ruth Rilling, AWS president said.
